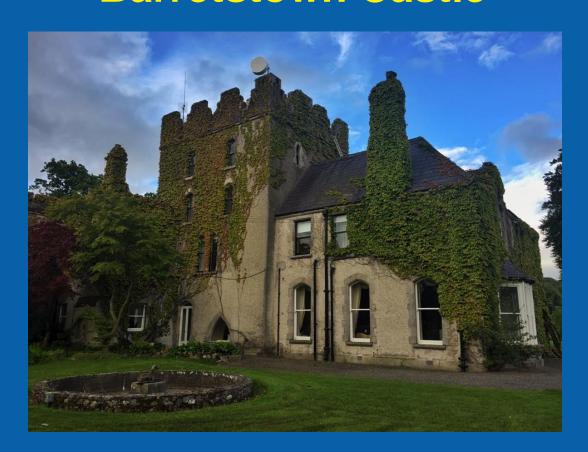

LOCATION

Ballymore Eustace, Ireland: Ballymore is a small town located approximately 45 km southwest of Dublin. The town is situated on the banks of the River Liffey in close proximity to the Wicklow border. As a small town of 900 people, the community was historically supported entirely by a woolen mill. Both Irish and English are the languages of this town, which in addition to maintaining rich Irish heritage, is home of Barretstown, a Serious Fun Camp!

GLOBAL FIELD AGENCY

Barretstown: My global field experience was with Barretstown, a Serious Fun Camp, that provides free, specially designed camps and programs for children living with a serious illness. They use a unique model called therapeutic recreation, which is a child-centered approach designed to meet the individual needs of each child/family member. The goal is to ensure that individuals gain, or regain, skills and an understanding of their own abilities, empowering them to make informed choices in other aspects of their lives.

At Barretstown, I worked alongside "caras" (friends), interpreters, and staff members from many different countries to create a fun, safe, and supportive environment for campers.

LESSONS LEARNED

- Relationships can be built without sharing a common language.
- It's okay to let down your barriers and be silly, laugh, smile and have fun.
- Children are extremely resilient.
- Not all chronic illnesses are physically visible.

ADVICE

- Familiarize yourself with the culture of the people that you will be working with: language, colloquial sayings, beliefs, religious background etc.
- Arrive a few days early to get used to your surroundings, especially if you will experience a time change.
- Take the time to have conversations with the locals. They have amazing stories to tell.
