


Supp. Figure S1: Pedigree of the family

**Supp. Figure S1.** Pedigree of the family. This figure represents the pedigree of the studied family with ANC data and clinical information. Samples from individuals marked with \* have been selected for IBD analysis. Samples from individuals marked with + have been used for Sanger sequencing.

**Supp. Figure S2.** Structure of V-ATPase. [Yao et al., 2007] Schematic illustration of the V-ATPases. V-ATPase complex is composed of a peripherally located  $V_1$  domain and membrane associated  $V_0$  domain. The  $V_1$  domain consists of eight different subunits and is responsible for ATP hydrolysis. The  $V_0$  domain consists of four different subunits and facilitates proton translocation.
