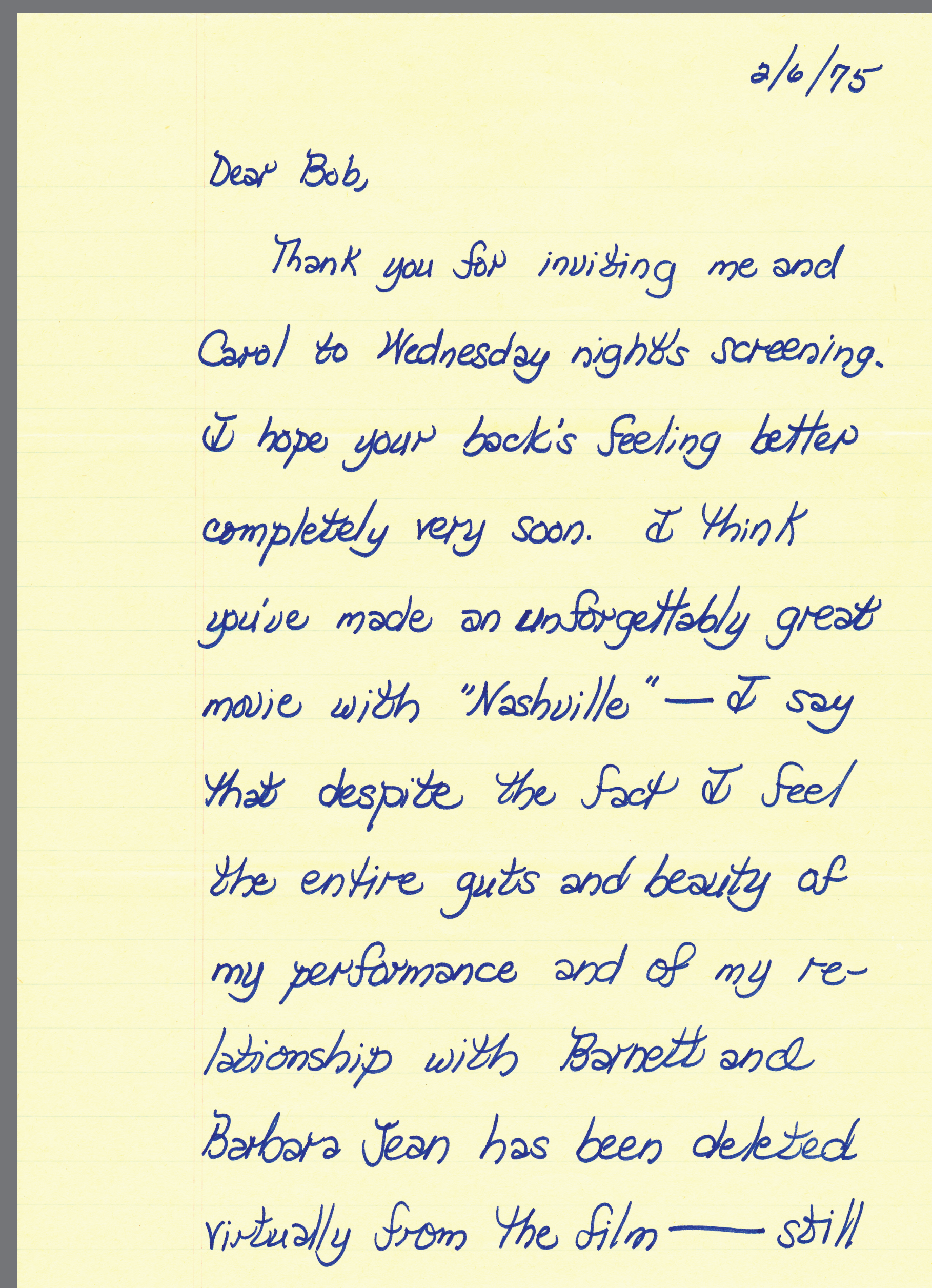


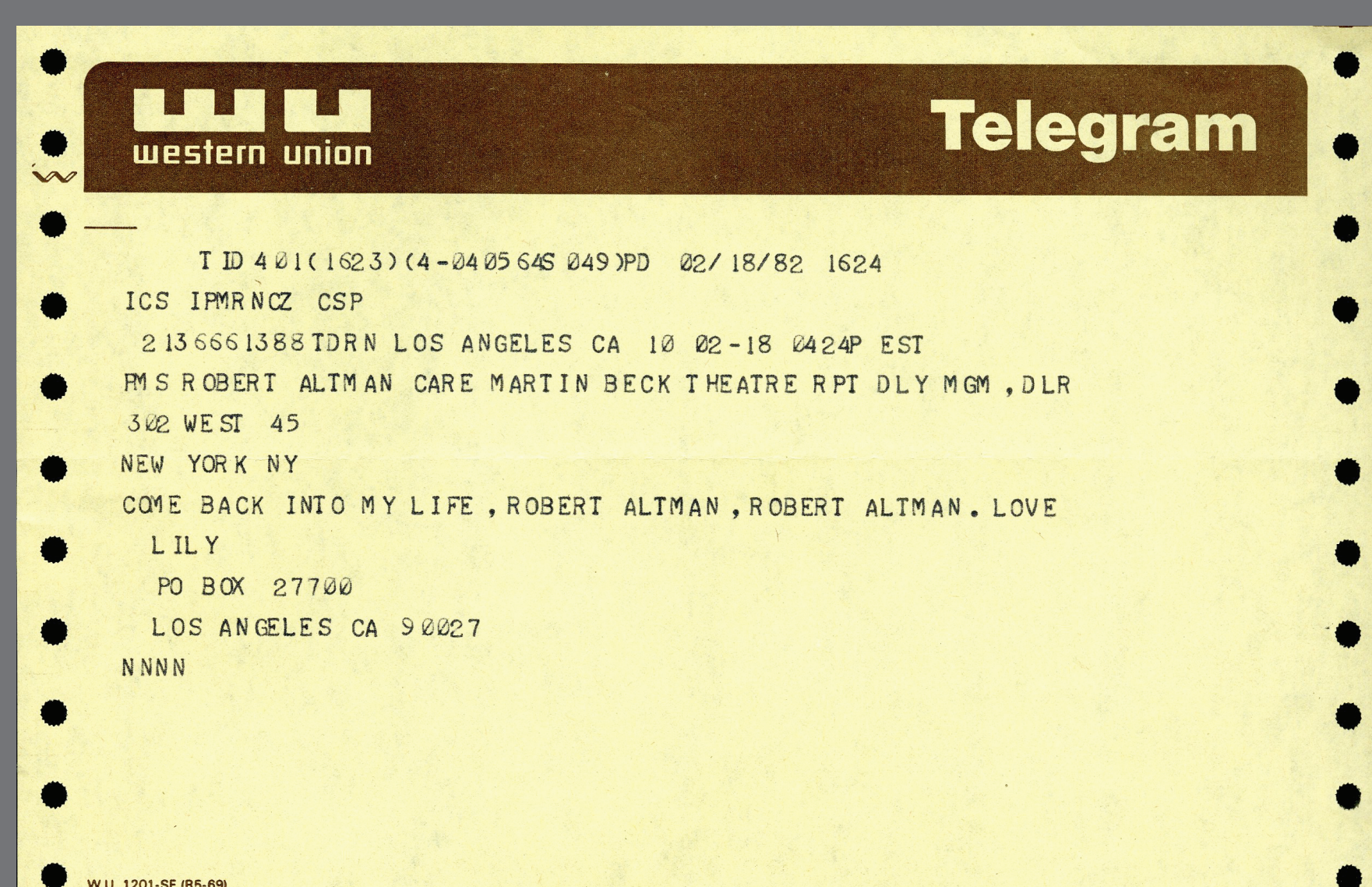
# Robert Altman and Actors
