Concerns:

We must take great care that we do not get swamped by all of the other issues swirling about an active campus such as ours and keep our focus on our most immediate and important priorities.

Key Steps in Dealing with Issues

- 1. Identification
- 2. Assessment: Determine what is possible and what is not.
- 3. Priority Assignment: Determine the priority of each issue by assessing how it relates to the present strategic objectives of the University.
- 4. Action Plan: Determine how the Administration will deal with each issue.
- 5. Identify key responsibilities for each issue and make appropriate assignments to members of the President's Council.
