Interview Questions

PEER-RAMPART:

As I described earlier, when researchers want to do a study like this where people have to be included without being asked, the rules of research require researchers to ask members of the community before starting the study for their thoughts about the study. In other words, the researchers have to ask the community for input on the study the researchers want to do. Does this seem like something important to do?

PROBE (ALL): Tell me more about this.

What groups of people do you think researchers ought to talk to before doing studies like the ones we've been talking about?

In the RAMPART study specifically, the one you were included in that was testing ways to treat seizure, who are the particular people or groups of people that you think researchers should have talked to in trying to get the community's thoughts on the study?

PEER-ProTECT:
