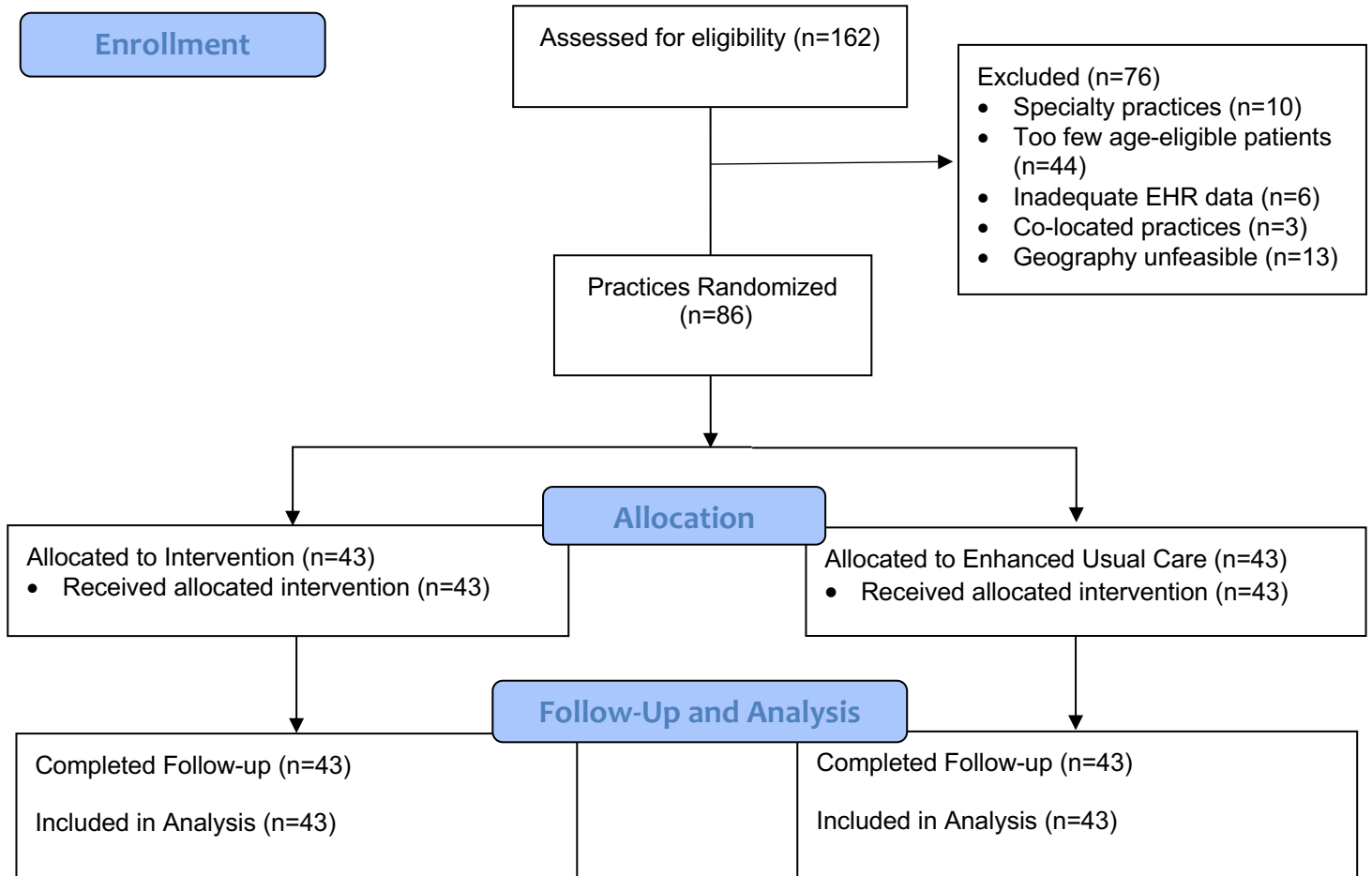
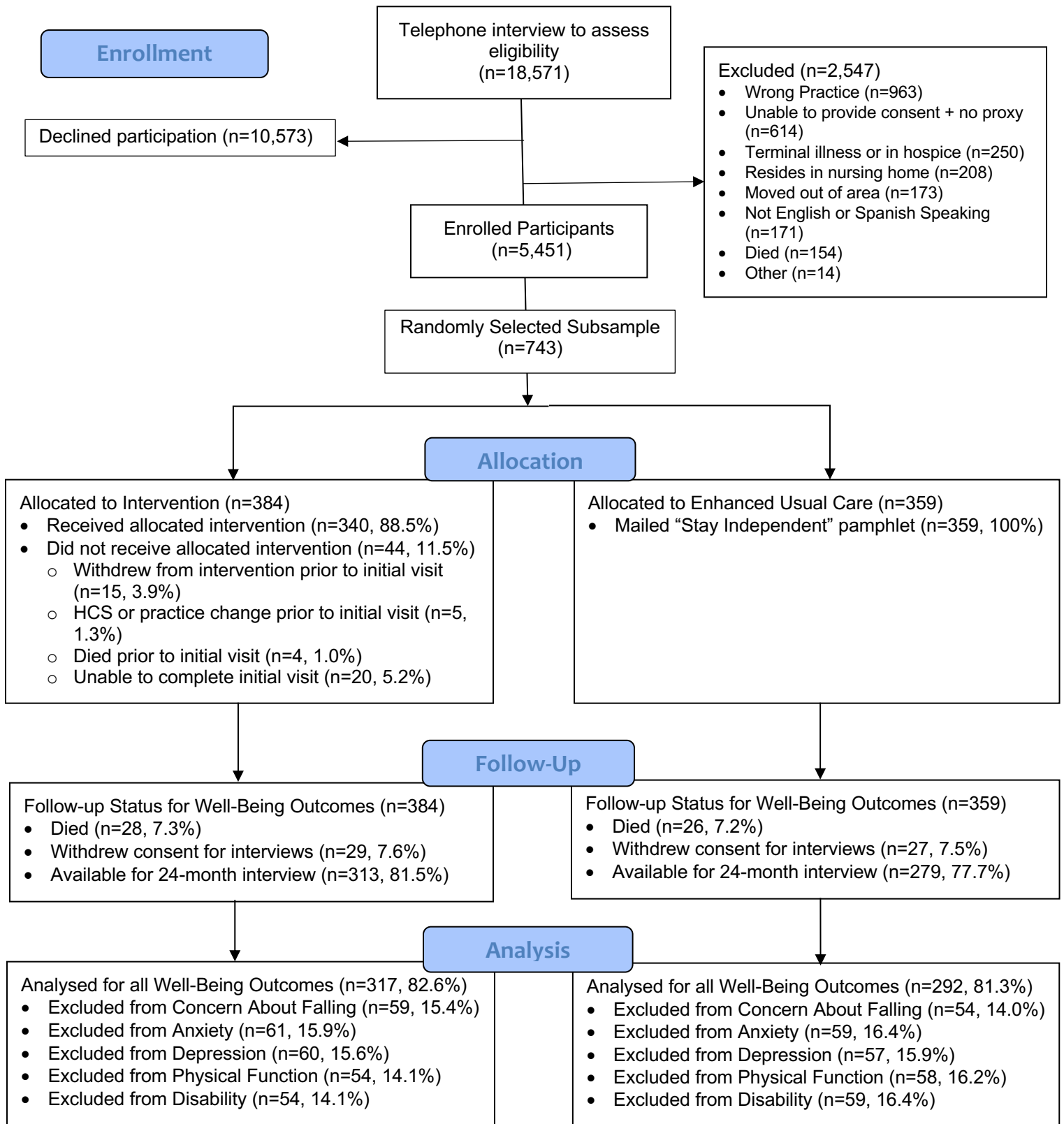

All 86 practices completed study follow-up and were included in the analysis.
