his is the second of two special issues of *Sociological Methods & Research* honoring the memory of Clifford C. Clogg. The articles by Hagenaars and Formann and Kohlmann intersect with Clogg's work on latent class analysis, while the article by Hayward and Lichter is more concerned with Clogg's substantive work on employment. Finally, the article by Becker, Minick, and Yang explores the relationship between log-linear and log-nonlinear models for contingency tables (an area in which Clogg made numerous contributions to the literature) and marginal models for contingency tables.

Those of us who knew Cliff will always remember his tremendous enthusiasm for research, both his own and that of others. We believe that he would have enjoyed reading and studying the articles in this volume and that he would have considered this collection to be "good stuff."
