## **EDITORIAL COMMENT**

We are expanding our editorial board to provide more rapid reviews and responses to those of you who submit articles. We believe that we are beginning a new and productive era for small group scholarship and practice and that this journal will have a major role to play. We encourage you, our readers, to provide us
