TO THE EDITOR:

"Peer Behavior Conceptualized as a Variable Influencing Infant and Toddler Developent," by Tony Apolloni and Thomas P. Cooke, (Journal, January 1975) comments on a very important area of study. The authors have critically evaluated the past research and have brought out some crucial issues in this area. However, while they have accused child development researchers of ignoring this topic, they have themselves ignored the growing body of literature on early peer relations in developmental psychology. Researchers such as Carol Eckerman, Lee Lee, Michael Lewis, and Edward Mueller have been pursuing this area in much detail.
