Preface

In a world that is in a ferment of technological and social change there are many forces operating to effect changes in the preparation and supervision of counselors. Perhaps most important of all is our intention that this issue serve to stimulate others to consider what is emergent in counselor education and supervision and to examine the applications and implication of these new developments before they become established. For this reason, it is suggested that this issue of the journal be regarded as a special resource for encouraging discussion and examination in classes, seminars, and inservice education programs.

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
