
This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act request for a copy of the Individual Deceased Personnel File (IDPF) pertaining to Robert A. Greenwood.

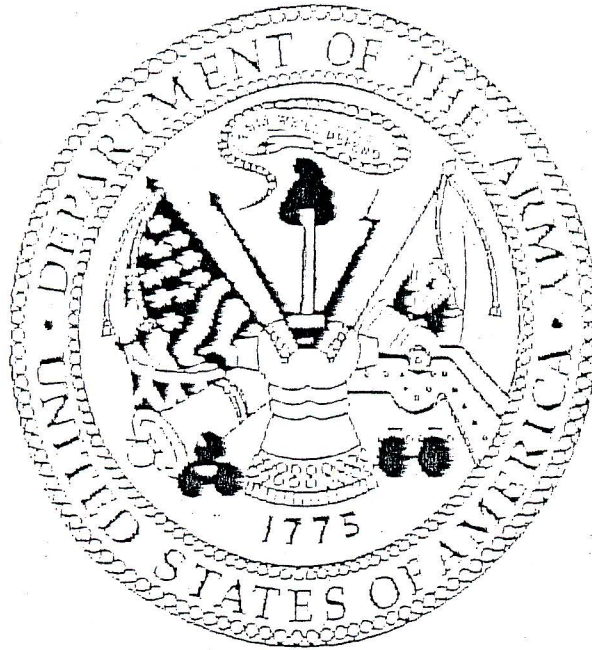

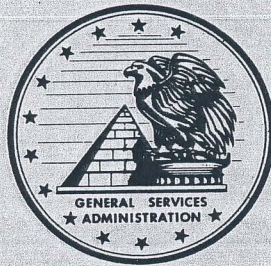

The remarriage of a non-service widow or widower of a deceased serviceman or woman automatically terminates the privilege of interment in a national cemetery. Cancellation of a reservation, except when due to remarriage, does not preclude the privilege of burial in the same grave with the deceased.

Acknowledgment is made of your letter, dated 30 November 1945, in behalf of Mrs. Helen G. Greenwood, Round Lake, New York, who desires information as to the burial of her husband, the late Second Lieutenant Robert A. Greenwood.

The official German burial report, received in this office through the agency of the American Legation, Bern, Switzerland, indicates that the remains of Lieutenant Greenwood were interred in the Community Cemetery at Usingen/Taunus, Germany. Our Graves Registration Service is continually searching for isolated graves for the purpose of concentrating the remains in American Military Cemeteries under the jurisdiction of United States Military authorities. You will be notified when a burial report of Lieutenant Greenwood is received.

It is contemplated that, in the case of group burials of this nature, when individual bodies cannot be identified, this office will obtain from the next of kin of each member of the group concerned, a consensus of their desires. This is to establish whether or not they will be agreeable to the burial location in the national cemetery which will be tentatively designated by this office.

For your information, it is the policy of this Department in all group burials to inter the remains of each group in one grave and erect a monument at the head of the grave with the name, rank, organization, date of death, and nature of death of each deceased, and to take pictures showing the individual inscriptions on the stone. This method has proved very satisfactory in each instance and you may rest assured, when the remains of Lieutenant Greenwood and the other members of the crew are returned, that this office will do everything within its power to carry out the wishes of the next of kin.

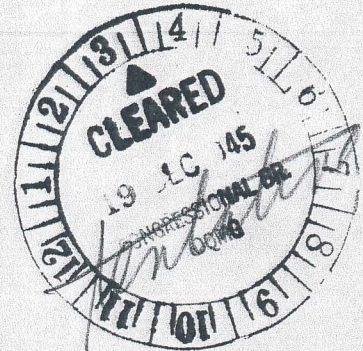

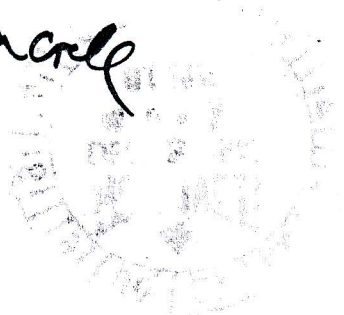
"My husband, 2nd Lt. Robert A. Greenwood was killed over
