1960s

- 1962-Michigan State University remodels Union restroom to deter homosexuals.

- 1966-First U.S. gay community center opens, in San Francisco, led by The Society for Individual Rights. *
- 1967-Officials are charged with concealing movie cameras to view homosexual activity in Wayne State University restrooms.
- 1967-Wayne State University administration agrees to destroy files on suspected homosexuals.
- 1967-First gay bookstore in the U.S. opens: Oscar Wilde Memorial Bookshop (in New York City). *
- 1968-The American Psychiatric Association moves homosexuality from sociopathic category to sexual deviation. *
- 1968-Michigan repeals criminal sexual psychopath law.
- 1969-Stonewall riots. *

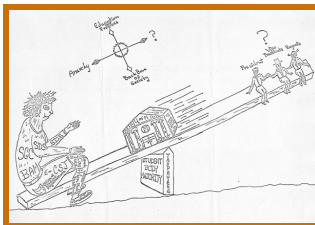

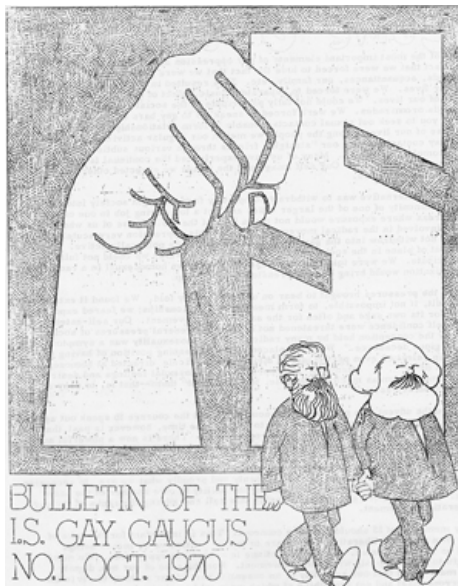

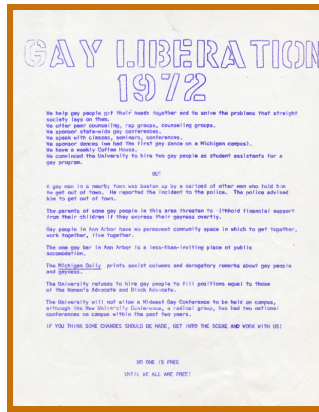

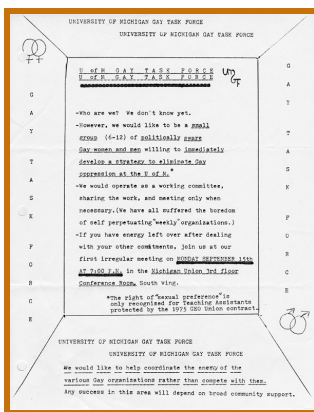

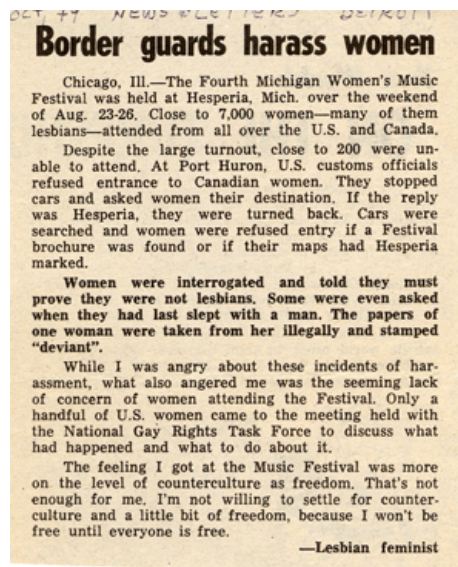

1980s

- 1981-First reported cases of what came to be called AIDS. *
- 1981-Michigan Department of Health reports states first two deaths from AIDS.
- 1983-State. Representative James Dressell introduces H.B. 5000 which would ban discrimination based on sexual orientation.
- 1984-President Harold Shapiro issues non-discrimination statement at the University of Michigan.
- 1984-State non-discrimination bill, H.B. 5000, fails to pass legislature.
- 1985-NAMES Project memorial quilt for AIDS victims launched. *
- 1985-University of Michigan law professor James Martin becomes Washtenaw County's first AIDS death.

STOP THE SPREAD

The following guidelines should be useful in most public and private settings to prevent the spread of disease.

WHEN SHOULD PRECAUTIONS BE TAKEN?

ALWAYS use precautions when handling cloth, paper, or surfaces that have been soiled with blood, urine, feces, vomitus, saliva, or semen.

WHAT PRECAUTIONS ARE ADVISED?

1. **Careful handwashing** is probably the single most important personal hygiene practice. Proper handwashing means soap and friction and rinsing thoroughly with warm water. Ordinary soap kills most harmful bacteria and viruses, including the AIDS virus and hepatitis B virus.
2. **Clean surfaces** contaminated with blood, urine, feces, or vomitus. Use household bleach diluted to 1% (one part gallon of water to other 99 parts).
3. **Wear disposable gloves** any time there will be contact with blood, urine, feces, semen, the inside of the mouth, the genital area, or soiled saliva.
4. **Do not share personal laboratory items**, such as razors and toothbrushes, that may potentially cause disease.
5. **Cover bleeding or soiling wounds** whenever possible. Gauze or band-aids are sufficient.
6. **Dispose of materials** soiled with both infectious respiratory fluids, urine, feces, paper products, etc.) carefully and promptly in a "leakproof" sealed bag or container.
7. **Where syringes and needles are used, they should not be broken.** Discard them intact, in plastic containers not in cardboard containers.
8. **USE COMMON SENSE. YOU CAN CONTROL THE SPREAD OF ANY DISEASE BY AVOIDING, REMOVING, OR REDUCING POSSIBLE SOURCES OF INFECTION.**

DO THESE PRECAUTIONS REDUCE THE RISK OF SPREADING AIDS?

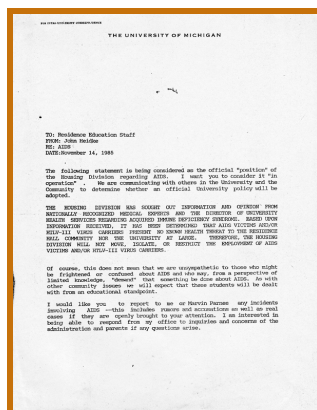
Yes. These precautions should inhibit the spread of the AIDS virus. It is important to remember that AIDS is not spread through the air, coughs and sneezes, swimming, hot-tubs, swimming pools, toilet seats, dishes, utensils, or food.

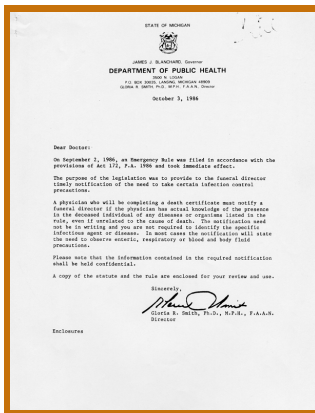

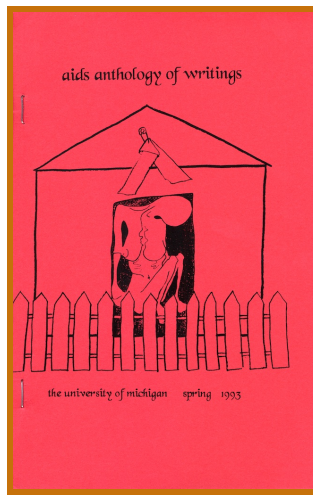

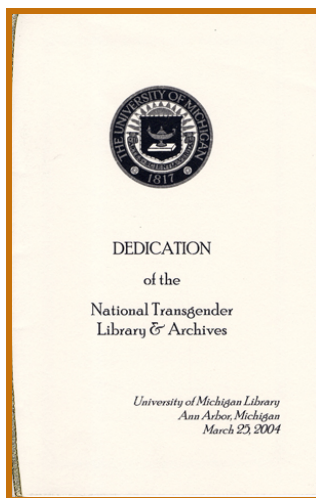

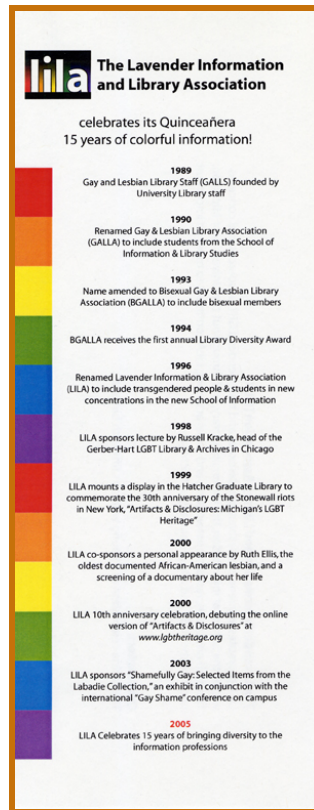
