How do we assign responsibility for each of the many issues which arise over the course of the year?

Keeping our eye on the ball...

Concerns:

We have set out a very ambitious agenda for the University that will require both great effort and strong teamwork (e.g., the Michigan Mandate, external relations effort, globalization,...).

We must take great care that we do not get swamped by all of the other issues swirling about an active campus such as ours and keep our focus on our most immediate and important priorities.

Key Steps in Dealing with Issues

- 1. Identification**
- 2. Assessment: Determine what is possible and what is not.**
- 3. Priority Assignment: Determine the priority of each issue by assessing how it relates to the present strategic objectives of the University.**
- 4. Action Plan: Determine how the Administration will deal with each issue.**
- 5. Identify key responsibilities for each issue and make appropriate assignments to members of the President's Council.**

Examples of Issues

Racial & Sexual Harrassment Policy	Continued assessment	EC, ZG, CMV, MAS (SAC)

The "Code".	Provide justification Develop draft Discuss with Board	EC, MAS (SAC)
Ethnic Politics	Keep focus on Michigan Mandate (high visibility)	CDM, CMV, WH (WH, SAC)
