


Figure 1.5 The Cathedral of the Holy Cross, Aghtamar Island, Armenia/Turkey, 921, view from SW (source: public domain)




Figure 1.6 Detail of exterior reliefs showing David and Goliath, Cathedral of the Holy Cross, Aghtamar Island, Armenia/Turkey (source: public domain)




Figure 1.9 Plan, Moldovița Monastery, Moldavia (source: Balş, *Bisericile și mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 195.)




Figure 1.10 Map of Mount Athos (source: Bogdanović, et al, *Chilandar*, inside the front cover.)




Figure 1.15 Plan, Manasija (Resava) Monastery, Serbia, 1406-1418 (source: Ćurčić, *Architecture in the Balkans*, 633, fig. 738.)




Figure 1.17 The Hodegetria icon of St. Anne, Bistrița Monastery, arrived in Moldavia in the early fifteenth century (source: Ștefan Cojocariu)




Figure 1.20 Elevation and plan, Church of the Dormition, Vad Monastery (source: Porumb, *Ştefan cel Mare şi Transilvania*, 24.)




Figure 1.22 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Parascheva, Feleac (source: Porumb, *Ştefan cel Mare şi Transilvania*, 22.)




Figure 2.1 Plans of Moldavian fortresses (Scheia, Neamţ, and Suceava), late fourteenth-early fifteenth centuries (source: Nicolescu, "Arta in epoca lui Ştefan cel Mare," 273, fig. 4.)




Figure 2.2 Plan, Suceava Fortress, Moldavia, rebuilt 1476-1479 (source: Ćurčić and Hadjitryphonos, eds., *Secular Medieval Architecture in the Balkans*, 186.)




Figure 2.3 Plan, Neamţ Fortress, Moldavia, rebuilt 1476-1479 (source: Ćurčić and Hadjitryphonos, eds., *Secular Medieval Architecture in the Balkans*, 189.)




Figure 2.6 Plan, "Baba Vida Fortress," Vidin, Bulgaria, early thirteenth century (source: Ćurčić and Hadjitryphonos, eds., *Secular Medieval Architecture in the Balkans*, 174.)




Figure 2.12 Church of the Holy Cross, Pelendri, Cyprus, second half of the twelfth century (source: public domain)




Figure 2.14 Elevation and plan, Church of the Raising of the True Cross, Volovăț, Moldavia (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 131.)




Figure 2.18 Constantine the Great and Helena with the True Cross, interior mural, west wall of the naos, Church of the Holy Cross, Pătrăuți Monastery (source: author)




Figure 3.2 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Nicholas, Probota Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile şi mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 13, 14.)




Figure 3.4 Katholikon of the Great Lavra, Mount Athos, lithograph of an older pen and ink drawing, Vassily Barsky, monk from Kiev, drawing 1744, lithograph 1887, .35 x .50 m (source: Mylonas, *Athos and its Monastic Institutions Through Old Engravings and Other Works of Art*, 57, no. 16.)




Figure 3.6 Elevation and plan, Church of the Holy Trinity, Siret (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 162.)




Figure 3.7 Plan, Church of the Ascension, Ravanica Monastery, Serbia, c.1375 (source: Ćurčić, *Architecture in the Balkans*, 680, Fig. 792/A.)




Figure 3.9 Plan, Church of the Trinity, Cozia Monastery (source: http://relevee.uauim.ro/146/)




Figure 3.14 Plan, Church of St. Demetrios, Veliko Tarnovo, c.1185 (source: Bichev, *Architecture in Bulgaria From Ancient Times to the Later 19th Century*, 37, fig. 22.)




Figure 3.15 Plan, Church of the Holy Virgin of Petrich, Assen's Fortress near Asenovgrad, twelfth-thirteenth centuries (source: Bichev, *Architecture in Bulgaria From Ancient Times to the Later 19th Century*, 40, fig. 25.)




Figure 3.16 Church of St. Shoghakat, Vagharshapat, Armenia, 1694, view from SW (source: Vigen Hakhverdyan)




Figure 3.17 Section, Hagia Sophia, Trebizond, 1238-1263 (source: Eastmond, *Art and Identity in Thirteenth-Century Byzantium: Hagia Sophia and the Empire of Trebizond*, 41, fig. 17.)




Figure 3.20 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Procopius, Bădeuți (Milișăuți) (source: Balș, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 26.)




Figure 3.22 Elevation and plan, Church of the Holy Cross, Pătrăuți Monastery, (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 23.)




Figure 3.24 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Elijah, Suceava (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 29.)




Figure 3.26 Elevation and plan, Church of St. George, Voroneț Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile și mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 90.)




Figure 3.28 Elevation and plan, Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Putna Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 145, 146.)




Figure 3.30 Elevation and plan, Church of the Ascension, Neamț Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 100.)




Figure 3.32 Elevation and plan, Church of the Descent of the Holy Spirit, Dobrovăț Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 119.)




Figure 3.34 Elevation and plan, Church of St. George, Baia (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 19.)




Figure 3.36 Elevation and plan, Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Borzești (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 83.)




Figure 3.38 Elevation and plan, Church of the Archangels Michael and Gabriel, Războieni Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 76.)




Figure 3.40 Elevation and plan, Church of St. John the Baptist, Piatra Neamţ (source: *Repertoriul*, 162.)




Figure 3.42 Elevation and plan, Church of the Archangels Michael and Gabriel, Scânteia (source: *Repertoriul*, 210.)




Figure 3.44 Elevation and plan, Church of the Beheading of St. John the Baptist, Reușeni (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 114.)




Figure 3.46 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Parascheva, Stefănești (source: Balș, *Bisericile și mănăstirile moldovenești din veacurile al XVII-lea si al XVIII-lea*, 77.)





Figure 3.48 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Parascheva, Cotnari (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 140.)








Figure 3.50 Elevation and plan, Church of the Beheading of St. John the Baptist, Arbore (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 113.)




Figure 3.51 Plan, chapel at Hotin Fortress, Moldavia, 1459 (source: *Repertoriul*, 207.)




Figure 3.52 Elevation and section, chapel at Hotin Fortress (source: *Repertoriul*, 208.)




Figure 3.54 Section and plan, Chapel of St. John the New, Bistrița Monastery (source: *Repertoriul*, 158.)




Figure 3.55 Plan, Church of St. Stephen (Lazarica), Kruševac, Serbia, 1377-1388 (source: Ćurčić, *Architecture in the Balkans*, 671, Fig. 783/A.)




Figure 3.56 Plan, Church of the Presentation of the Mother of God, Kalenić Monastery, Serbia, 1407-1413 (source: Ćurčić, *Architecture in the Balkans*, 671, Fig. 783/E.)




Figure 3.58 Plan, Church of the Beheading of St. John the Baptist, Vaslui (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 65.)




Figure 3.60 Plan, Church of St. Nicholas, Iași (source: Balș, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 61.)




Figure 3.62 Elevation and plan, Church of St. George, Hârlău (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 50.)




Figure 3.64 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Nicholas, Dorohoi (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 38.)




Figure 3.66 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Nicholas, Botoşani (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 44.)




Figure 3.68 Elevation and plan, Church of the Birth of the Virgin, Tazlău Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 70.)




Figure 3.70 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Parascheva, Dolheștii Mari (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 127.)




Figure 3.72 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Nicholas, Bălinești (source: Balș, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 134.)




Figure 3.74 Elevation and plan, Church of St. George, St. John the New Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ştefan cel Mare*, 170, 171.)




Figure 3.76 Elevation and plan, Church of All Saints, Părhăuți (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 180.)




Figure 3.78 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Demetrios, Hârlău (source: Balş, *Bisericile și mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 70.)




Figure 3.80 Elevation and plan, Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Humor Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile şi mănăstirile moldoveneşti din veacul al XVI-lea*, 23.)




Figure 3.82 Elevation and plan, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile și mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 30, 31.)




Figure 3.84 Elevation and plan, Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Baia (source: Balş, *Bisericile şi mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 43.)




Figure 3.86 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Demetrios, Suceava (source: Balş, *Bisericile şi mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 48.)




Figure 3.88 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Nicholas, Coșula Monastery (source: Balș, *Bisericile și mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 58.)




Figure 3.90 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Nicholas, Râșca Monastery (source: Balș, *Bisericile și mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 78.)




Figure 3.92 Elevation and plan, Church of the Assumption of the Virgin, Bistrița Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile și mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 122, 123.)




Figure 3.96 Exterior buttresses, north wall, Church of St. John the Baptist, Piatra Neamț (source: author)




Figure 3.102 Main entrance to the church, west façade, Church of the Holy Cross, Pătrăuți Monastery (source: author)




Figure 3.103 Main entrance to the church, west wall, inside the exonarthex, Church of the Annunciation, Moldoviţa Monastery (source: author)




Figure 3.104 Elevation drawing for a Gothic portal frame, southern German, 1446 (source: Böker, *Architektur der Gotik*, 307, fig. 16.996.)




Figure 3.108 Schulterbogenportal, interior, threshold between pronaos and naos, Church of the Beheading of St. John the Baptist, Arbore (source: author)




Figure 3.109 Schulterbogenportal, exterior, south wall, Black Church, Braşov (source: author)




Figure 3.112 Schulterbogenportal, interior, threshold between pronaos and burial chamber, Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Humor Monastery (source: http://ortodox.ro/manastiri/manastirea_humor.html)




Figure 3.114 South wall, windows in pronaos, burial chamber, and naos, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 3.117 Drawings of tracery windows, c.1465, attributed to Laurenz Spenning (source: Böker, *Architektur der Gotik*, 316, fig. 17.004.)




Figure 3.123 Elevation and plan, Church of St. Nicholas, Rădăuți Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile lui Ștefan cel Mare*, 158, 159, 160.)




Figure 3.125 Plan, Catholic Cathedral, Baia (source: Grigoraș and Caproșu, *Biserici si mănăstiri Vechi din Moldova*, 61.)




Figure 3.127 Cathedral of the Dormition, Vladimir, c.1160-c.1180 (source: public domain)




Figure 3.130 Plan, Church of St. Nicholas, St. Nicholas Monastery, Kuršumlija (source: Ćurčić, *Architecture in the Balkans*, 492, fig. 553.)




Figure 3.132 Church of the Forty Martyrs, Veliko Tarnovo, Bulgaria, 1230, view from NW (source: Nenko Lazarov)




Figure 3.133 Plan, Church of the Forty Martyrs (source: Kandi)




Figure 4.4 Brick underpainting, south window, burial chamber, Church of the Ascension, Neamț Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.9 NE wall, Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Humor Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.11 Brick and stone underpainting, south wall, Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Humor Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.13 South wall, Church of St. Demetrios, Suceava (source: author)




Figure 4.14 Main dome, Parekklesion of the Church of the Theotokos Pammakaristos, Constantinople (Fethiye Camii), 1292 (source: Müller-Wiener, *Bildlexikon zur Topographie Istanbuls*, 134, fig. 123.)




Figure 4.15 Main dome and northern exonarthex dome, Katholikon of the Chora Monastery, Constantinople (Kariye Camii), eleventh century (source: Ousterhout, *The Architecture of the Kariye Camii in Istanbul*, fig. 153.)




Figure 4.18 Church of St. Stephen, Banjska Monastery, Serbia, 1312-1316, view from SE (source: Ćurčić, *Architecture in the Balkans*, 658, fig. 768.)




Figure 4.20 Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Borzești, Moldavia, view from E (source: author)




Figure 4.29 South apse, naos, interior, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.37 Military saints, north wall, naos, interior, to the left of north apse window, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.43 Dome, naos, interior, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.51 The Annunciation, east wall above the entryway, pronaos, interior, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.54 *Tree of Jesse*, exterior mural, burial chamber, south wall, Church of St. Nicholas, Probota Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.63 Detail, *Tree of Jesse*, drawing with black ink on paper, Dionysiou Monastery, Mount Athos (source: *Treasures of Mount Athos*, 177.)




Figure 4.64 St. Athanasios the Athonite, grisaille on paper, 29 cm x 16.3 cm, sixteenth century, Simonopetra Monastery, Mount Athos (source: *Treasures of Mount Athos*, 174.)




Figure 4.65 *Christ Washing the Feet of His Disciples*, grisaille on paper, 31.5 cm x 22 cm, sixteenth century, Dionysiou Monastery (source: *Treasures of Mount Athos*, 175.)




Figure 4.69 *Akathistos Hymn*, south wall, Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Humor Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.70 *Akathistos Hymn*, south wall, Church of St. Nicholas, Probota Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.86 *The Heavenly Customs*, mural, north wall, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.92 *The Last Judgment*, mural, east wall, exonarthex, interior, Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Humor Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.99 *The Last Judgment*, mural, south wall, Church of St. Nicholas, Râșca Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.101 *Deésis*, exterior mural, south wall, directly above main entrance, Church of St. George, Voroneț Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.103 *The Genesis Cycle*, mural, west façade, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.104 *The Genesis Cycle*, mural, west façade, Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Humor Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.112 *Passion altarpiece*, c.1510-1515, Cloister Ihlow, Flemish, from Antwerp, now in St. Lambert's Church, Aurich




Figure 4.113 *Passion altarpiece*, c.1510-1515, Cloister Ihlow, Flemish, from Antwerp, now in St. Lambert's Church, Aurich




Figure 4.116 Altar niche, Church of St. Nicholas, Probota Monastery (source: http://www.manastireaprobota.ro/english_painting.html)




Figure 4.117 Bishops, altar area, Church of St. Nicholas, Probota Monastery (source: www.probota.ro)




Figure 4.119 Royal Doors, iconostasis, second quarter of the sixteenth century, tempera on wood; gilded, 108.5 cm x 76.6 cm, National Museum of Art, Bucharest, inv. 11092/L 41 (source: *Arta din Moldova de la Ştefan cel Mare la Movilești*, 47, plate 3.)




Figure 4.124 Detail, iconostasis, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.131 Interior, naos, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.132 View of iconostasis (L) and exterior of eastern apse (R), Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.137 Portal leading into the pronaos, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.138 Interior, view from naos looking toward the entrance, Church of St. Nicholas, Probota Monastery (source: author)




Figure 4.141 Directional spatial emphasis, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author scan)




Figure 5.2 Interior view, naos, south aisle, Church of St. Nicholas, Rădăuți Monastery (source: author)




Figure 5.3 The tomb of Archbishop Daniel II, fourteenth century, Church of the Holy Apostles, Pec, 1266 (source: http://www.kosovo.net/grstones.html)




Figure 5.5 Tomb of Alexander the Good, burial chamber, Bistrița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 5.7 Plan, Church of St. Nicholas, Kuršumlija Monastery, Serbia, c.1166-1168 (source: Ćurčić, *Architecture in the Balkans*, 492, fig. 553.)




Figure 5.8 Plan, Bistrița Monastery, Moldavia (source: Bălan, *Mănăstirea Bistrița*, 31.)




Figure 5.9 Plan, Church of the Virgin Mary, Studenica Monastery, 1183-1186 (source: Ćurčić, *Architecture in the Balkans*, 495, fig. 559.)




Figure 5.10 Plan, Church of the Ascension (Vaznesenje), Mileševa Monastery, before 1250 (source: Ćurčić, *Architecture in the Balkans*, 502, fig. 568.)




Figure 5.14 Tombs of Stephen the Great (left) and Maria of Mangup (right), Church of the Dormition of the Virgin, Putna Monastery (source: *Sfânta Mănăstire Putna*, 130.)




Figure 5.22 Grave stone of Hugues Libergier (1229-1263), Reims Cathedral, 275 x 135 x 25 cm (source: http://www.cathedrale-reims.culture.fr/HTML/III-13_51_01175_NUCA.html)




Figure 5.23 Grave stone of a magistrate, now in the Museé de Beaux-Arts in Arras, France (source: Bauch, *Das mittelalterliche Grabbild*, fig. 420.)




Figure 5.28 Plans, Neamţ Fortress (detail of the east side of the fortress) (a), Royal House from Probota Monastery (1530) (b), Royal House from Cetăţuia Monastery (c) (source: Năstase, "Despre spaţiul funerar în arhitectura moldovenească," 206, fig. 7.)




Figure 5.35 *The Parable of the Prodigal Son,* exterior mural, south wall, Church of St. Nicholas, Probota Monastery (source: author)




Figure 5.38 *Deésis,* interior mural, burial chamber, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 5.39 *Deésis,* interior mural, burial chamber, Church of the Descent of the Holy Spirit, Dobrovăț Monastery (source: author)




Figure 5.46 Interior, burial chamber, looking west, Church of St. Nicholas, Probota Monastery (source: author)




Figure 5.47 Antimension from the sacristy of Simonpetra Monastery, Mount Athos, painted on linen, 42 x 54.5 cm, sixteenth century (source: *Treasures of Mount Athos*, 418-419.)




Figure 5.55 *Tetraevangelion*, fol. 5v, Cod.Slav.7, 1502, Österreichische Nationalbibliothek, Vienna (source:




Figure 6.5 *Map of Constantinople*, c.1422, Cristoforo Buondelmonti, *Liber Insularum Archipelagi* (source: Bibliothèque nationale de France, Paris)


Figure 6.18 *Siege of Constantinople in 860*, interior mural, naos, Cathedral of Our Lady of Smolensk, Novodevichiy Convent, Moscow, painted mid-sixteenth century (source: http://www.peggysphotos.com/moscow-day-4b/)




Figure 6.22 *The Procession of the Hodegetria Icon* (drawing), Blachernae Monastery, Arta (source: Vassilaki, ed., *Mother of God*, 376, fig. 211.)




Figure 6.24 Detail of *Akathistos Hymn* showing the illustration of Stanza 23, mural, south wall, Church of the Annunciation, Moldovița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 6.25 *The Procession of the Hodegetria Icon in Moscow,* Embroidered Icon of Helena Voloshanka, 1498 (?), State Historical Museum, Moscow (source: Vassilaki, ed., *Mother of God*, 52, fig. 23.)




Figure 6.30 Map of Moldavia at the turn of the sixteenth century highlighting the major fortresses built by Stephen the Great between 1457 and 1487 (source: *Bucovina*, 26.)




Figure 7.2 Elevation and plan, Church of the Resurrection, Sucevița Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile și mănăstirile moldovenești din veacul al XVI-lea*, 160, 161.)




Figure 7.3 West wall, pronaos, interior, Church of the Resurrection, Sucevița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 7.6 East wall, Church of the Resurrection, Sucevița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 7.7*Tree of Jesse*, exterior mural, south wall, Church of the




Figure 7.11 South porch, Church of the Resurrection, Sucevița Monastery (source: author)




Figure 7.13 Elevation and plan, Church of the Ascension, Galata Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile şi mănăstirile moldoveneşti din veacurile al XVII-lea si al XVIII-lea*, 10.)




Figure 7.15 Elevation and plan, Church of the Descent of the Holy Spirit, Dragomirna Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile şi mănăstirile moldoveneşti din veacurile al XVII-lea si al XVIII-lea*, 27.)




Figure 7.17 Plan, Church of the Three Hierarchs, Three Hierarch Monastery (source: Balş, *Bisericile şi mănăstirile moldoveneşti din veacurile al XVII-lea si al XVIII-lea*, 135.)




Figure 7.20 Detail of the exterior sculptures, Three Hierarchs Church, Iași (source: author)




Figure 7.21 Detail of the exterior sculptures, Three Hierarchs Church, Iași (source: author)




Figure 7.22 Line drawings of the exterior carvings of the Church of the Three Hierarchs (source: Balş, *Bisericile şi mănăstirile moldoveneşti din veacurile al XVII-lea si al XVIII-lea*, 141.)
