We think there is a gap in the standardized research data management guidance available for researchers who are concerned about DEIA issues in their work.

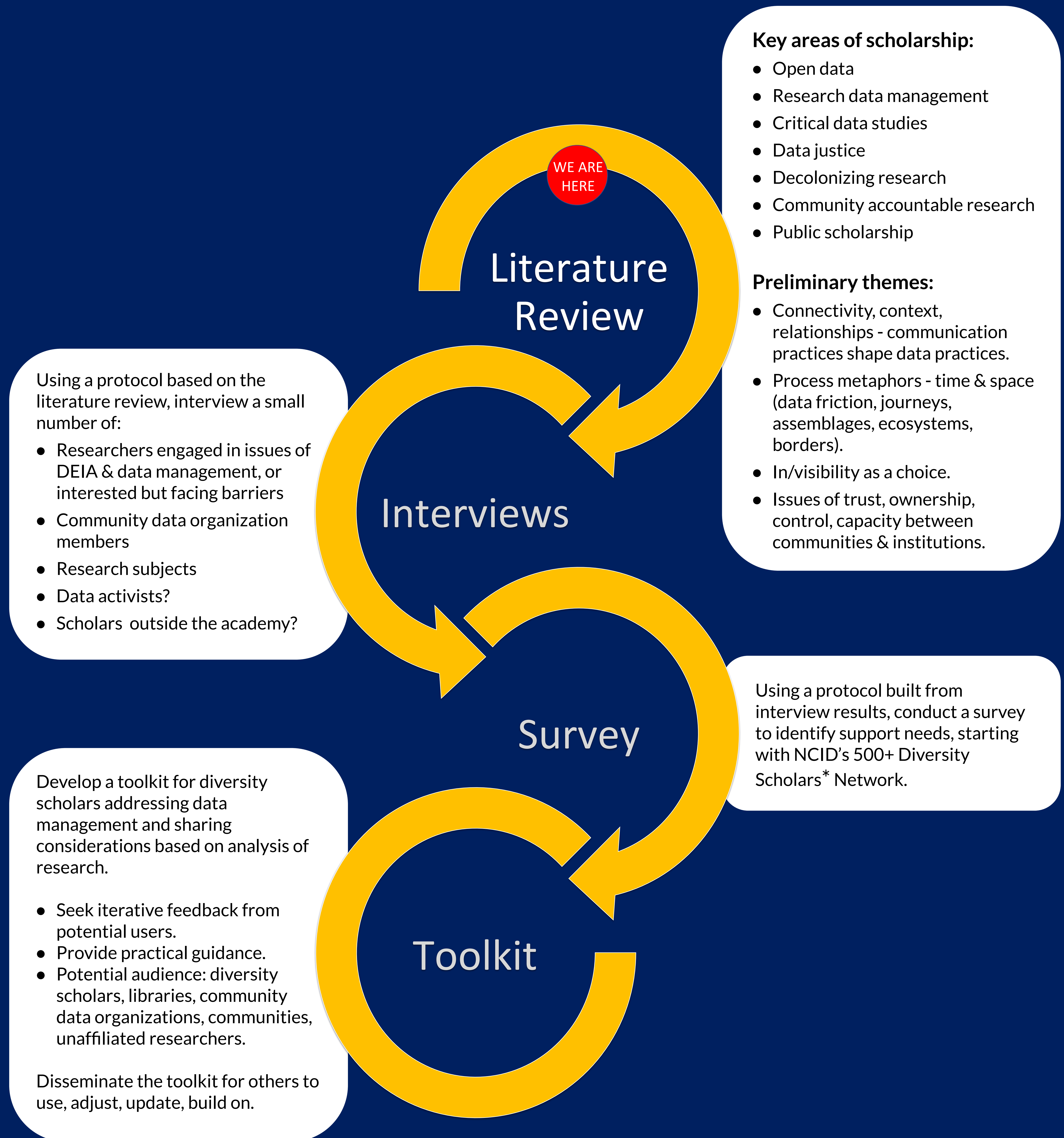
