Using a step-by-step approach, she outlines and discusses each stage, ultimately leading to the victim regaining "self" power. Both female and male rape victims are addressed, although most of the examples concern women. The book is narrated by Braswell, which is a minor weakness since she is not a professional reader. Substantial portions of the presentation do not deal with verbal self-defense. The cassettes, in part, contain academic ideas about language analysis that would be hard to use in the real world of a rapidly moving argument. The strongest parts of Elgin's work are discussions of male and female patterns of communicating and the need for understanding the conversational style of other persons. The technique they advocate is to release one's compulsivity to God and follow the Christian spirit to a life of balance and harmony. These tapes will be most appreciated by library patrons who seek selfhelp ideas from several viewpoints with a Christian slant. 
