

## Women and minorities are **especially** under-represented in academic surgery. **These disparities increase at every step of the academic surgery hierarchy.**




Gender Representation in the Surgery Pipeline (2016)

She received her medical degree from Yale University in 2010 and holds a Masters in Public Health from Johns Hopkins. She completed her general surgery residency at the Brigham and Women's Hospital/Harvard Medical School in 2017 and colorectal surgery fellowship at the University of Minnesota in 2018. Dr. Kwakye joined the faculty at the University of Michigan in 2018. Her clinical expertise is in the treatment of colon and rectal oncology, inflammatory bowel disease, anorectal disorders and utilizing minimally invasive approaches to colorectal disease. 
