General tips for searching


- Phrase searching (“”)
- Truncation (*)
- Try many different keywords
- Boolean “OR”
- Boolean “AND”
- Combine strategies
- Iterate

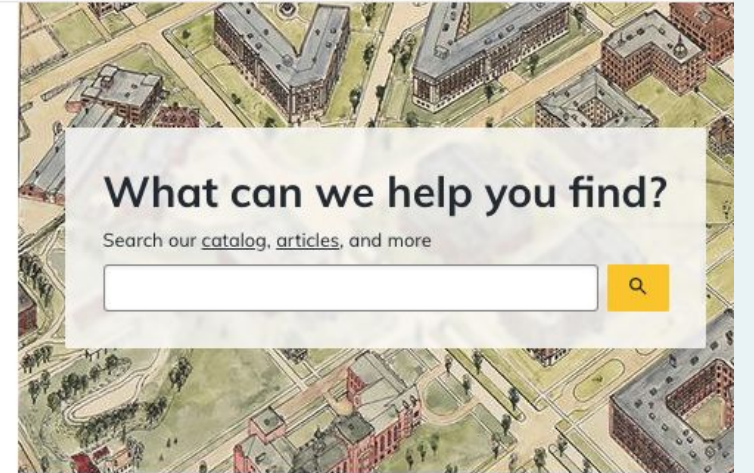

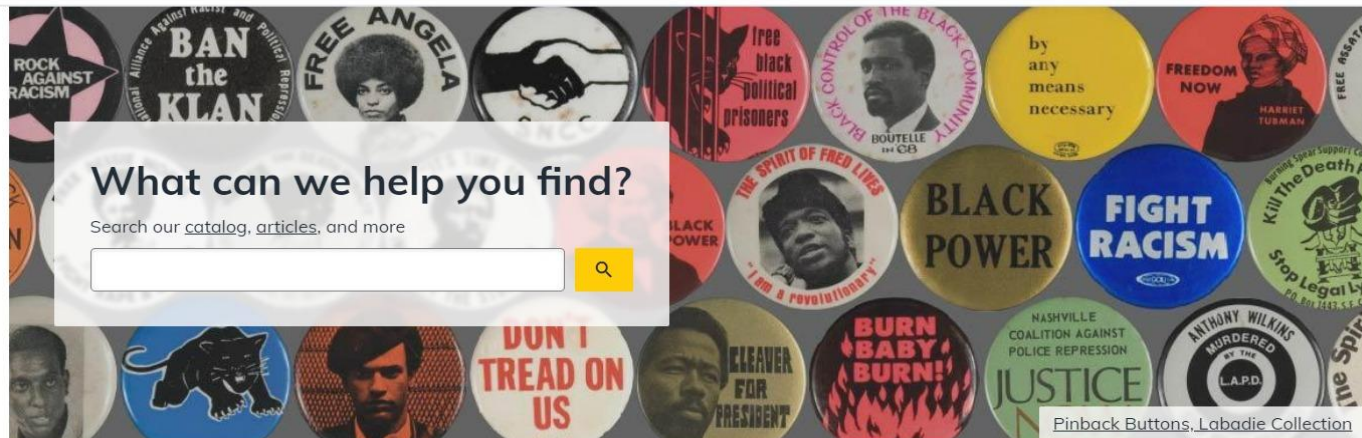
