How do you begin researching a question?


General tips for searching

- Phrase searching ("")
- Truncation (*)
- Try many different keywords
- Boolean "OR"
- Boolean "AND"
- Combine strategies
- Iterate

THE GREAT WIDE INTERNET! (Using the search engine of your choice)


Tip: Use site search

Tip: <u>Open Access Button</u>, <u>Unpaywall</u>, or other browser extensions to find legal, free versions of research articles




Google Scholar

Tip: use <u>link on library homepage</u> to be sure you're signed in!




