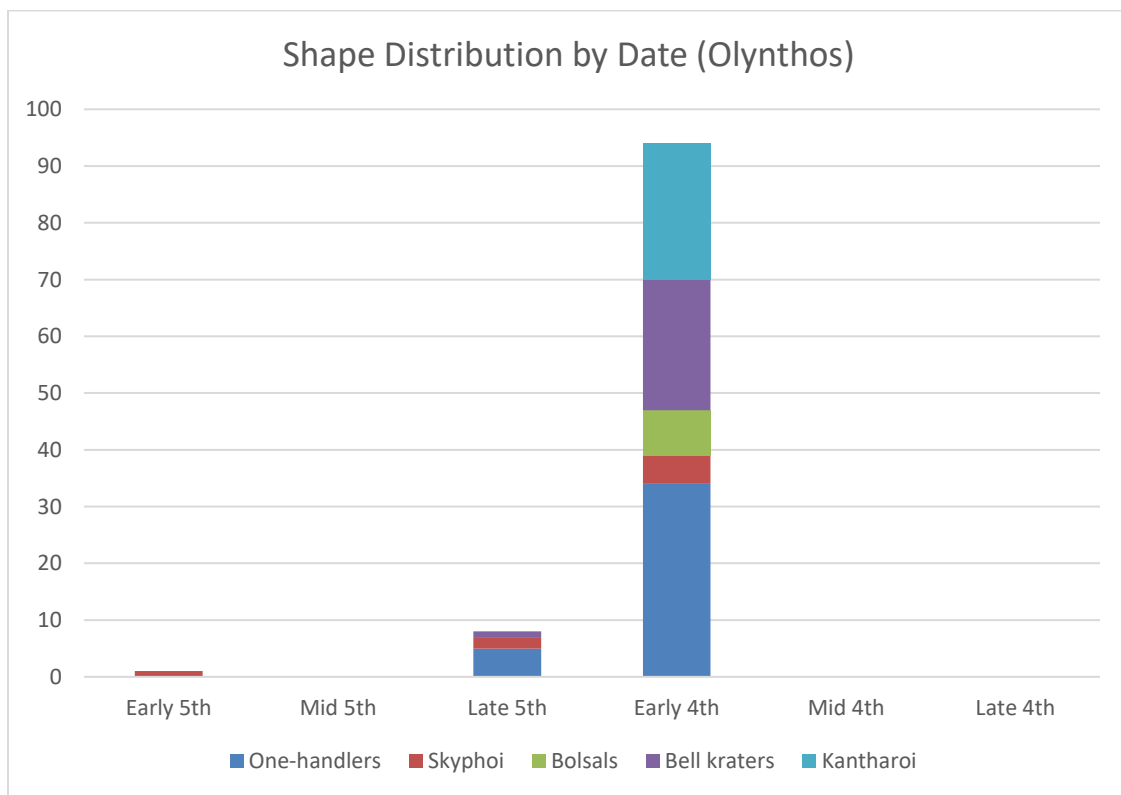


Fig. 2.1. Shape distribution at Olynthos by date (n=116).¹

¹ Here I am using the dates given by Robinson in the pottery publications from Olynthos. I acknowledge that these dates are problematic and plan to make adjustments in the future.

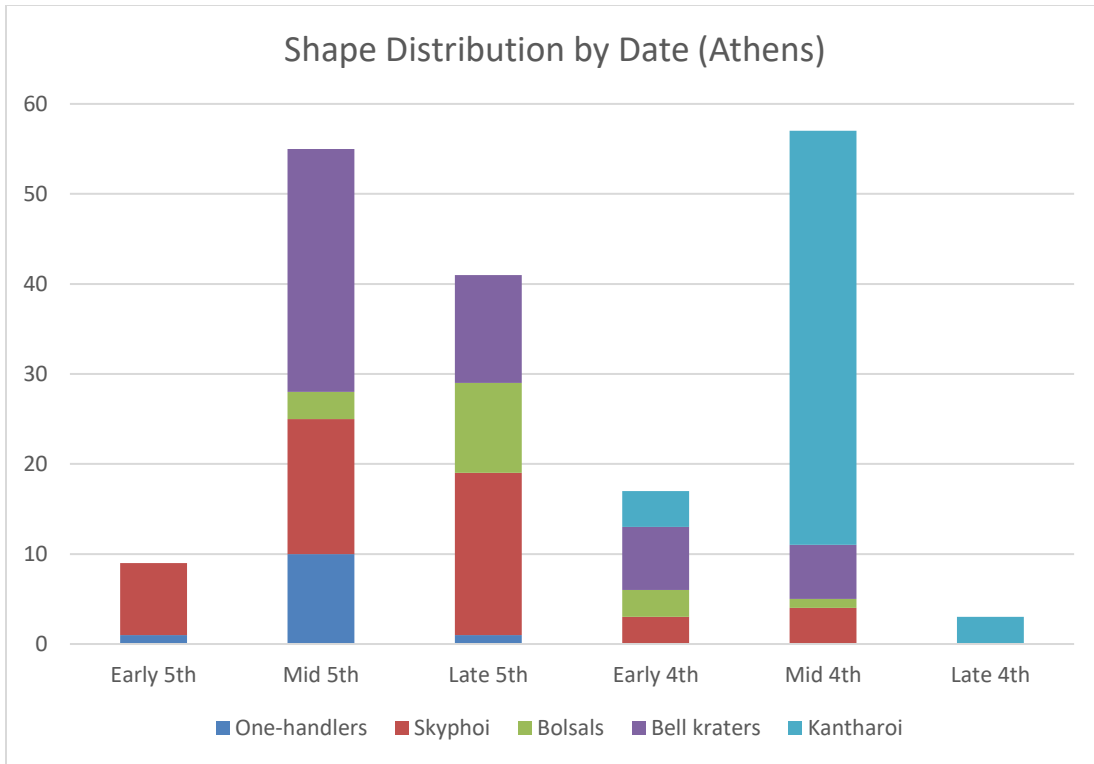


Fig. 2.2. Shape distribution at Athens by date (n=192).

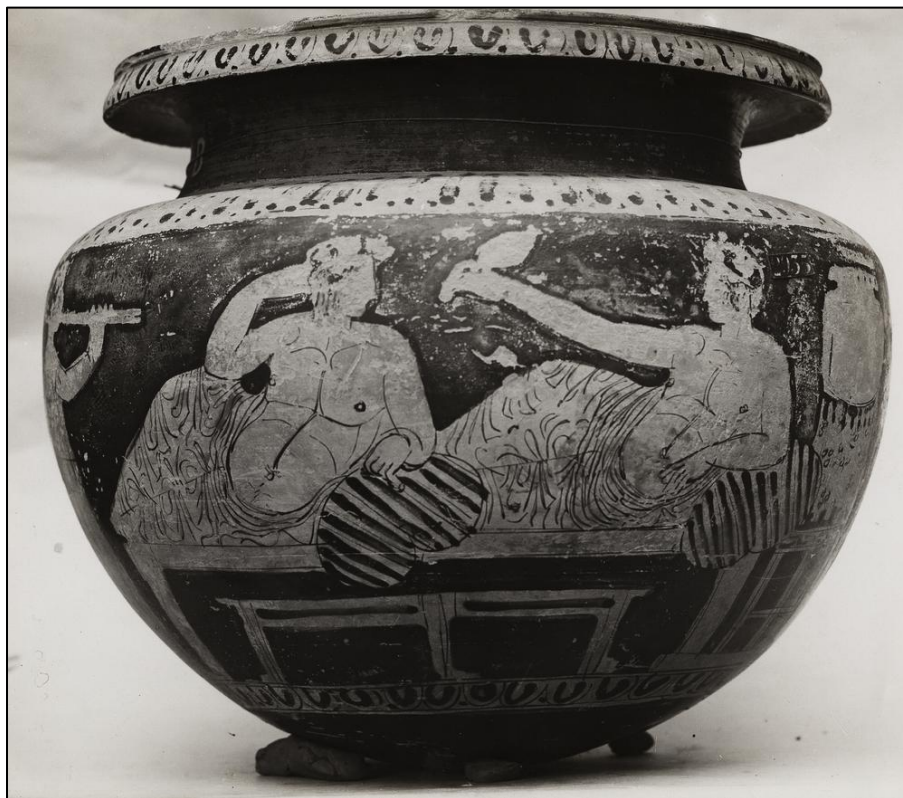


Fig. 3.1. Lebes depicting a symposium, attributed to the Nikias Painter. (British Museum: 1842,0728.841)

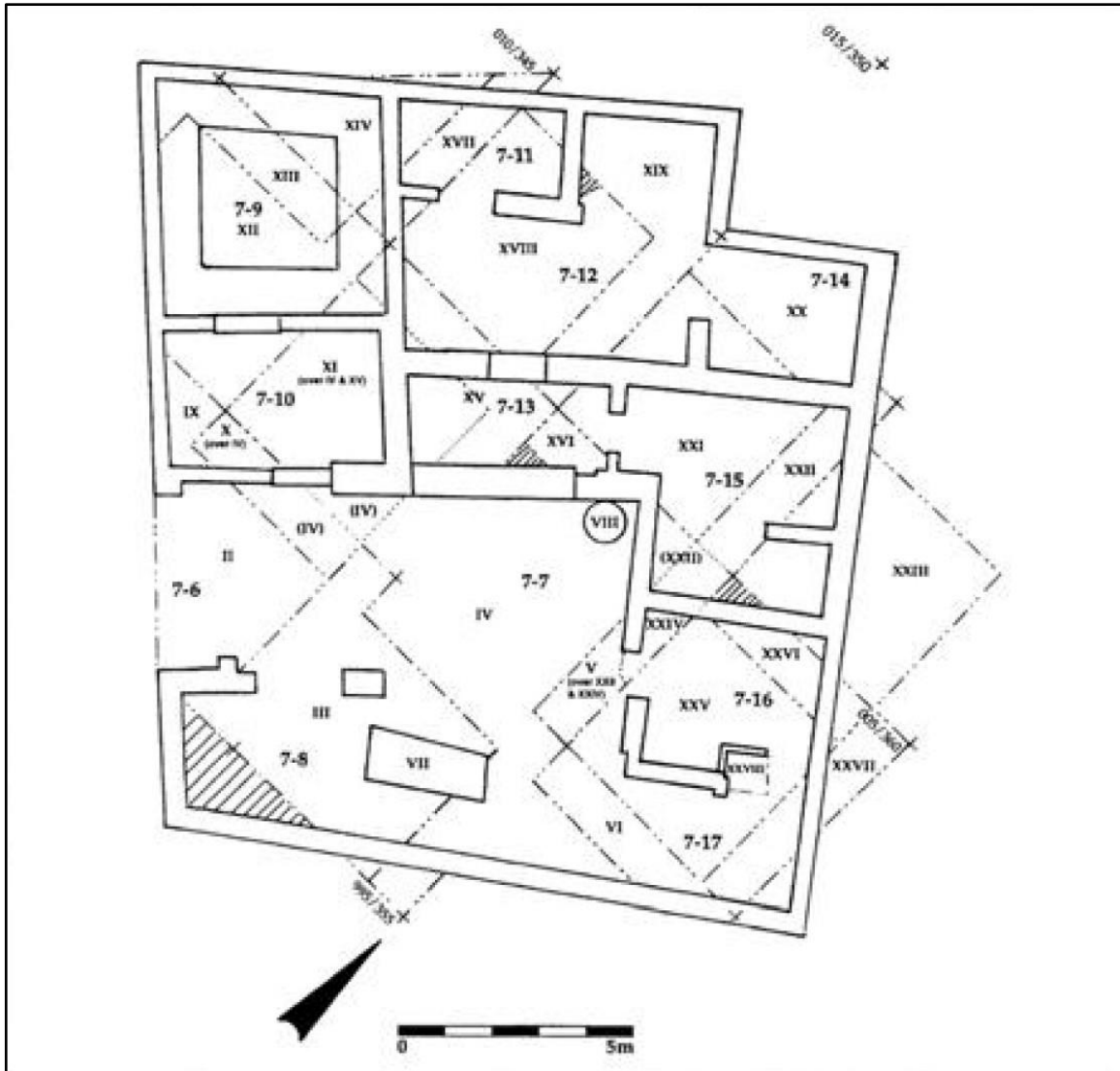


Fig. 3.3. Plan of house 7 at Halieis. (Ault and Nevett 1999, fig. 4.4)

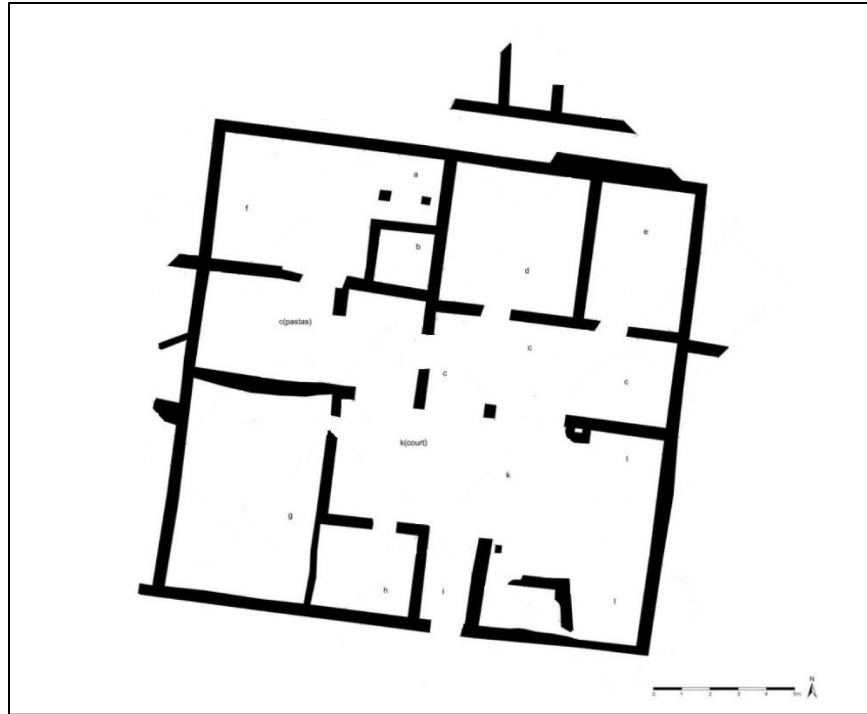


Fig. 3.4. Plan of house B ix 6. (After Nevett et al. 2020, fig. 18 (Filippos Stefanou))

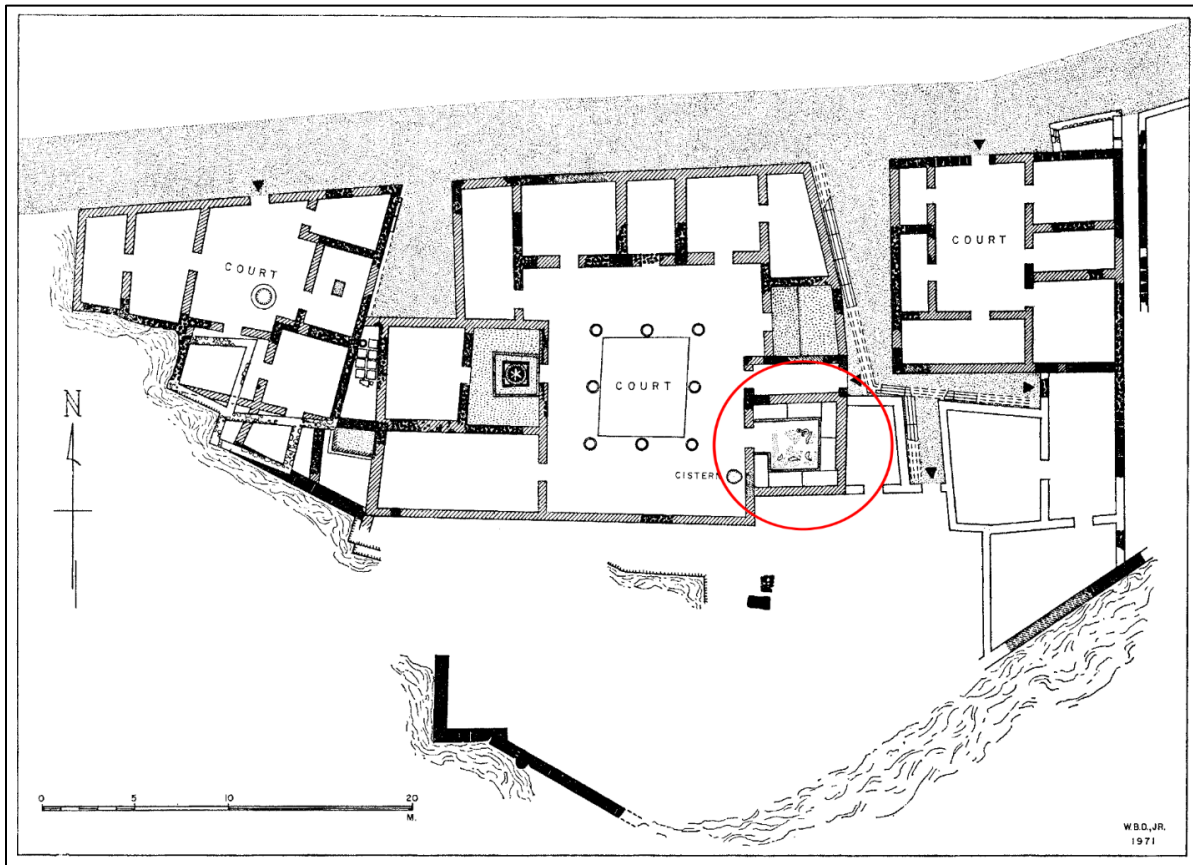


Fig. 3.5. Houses from near the Athenian Agora with *andron* indicated. (Shear 1973, fig. 4)

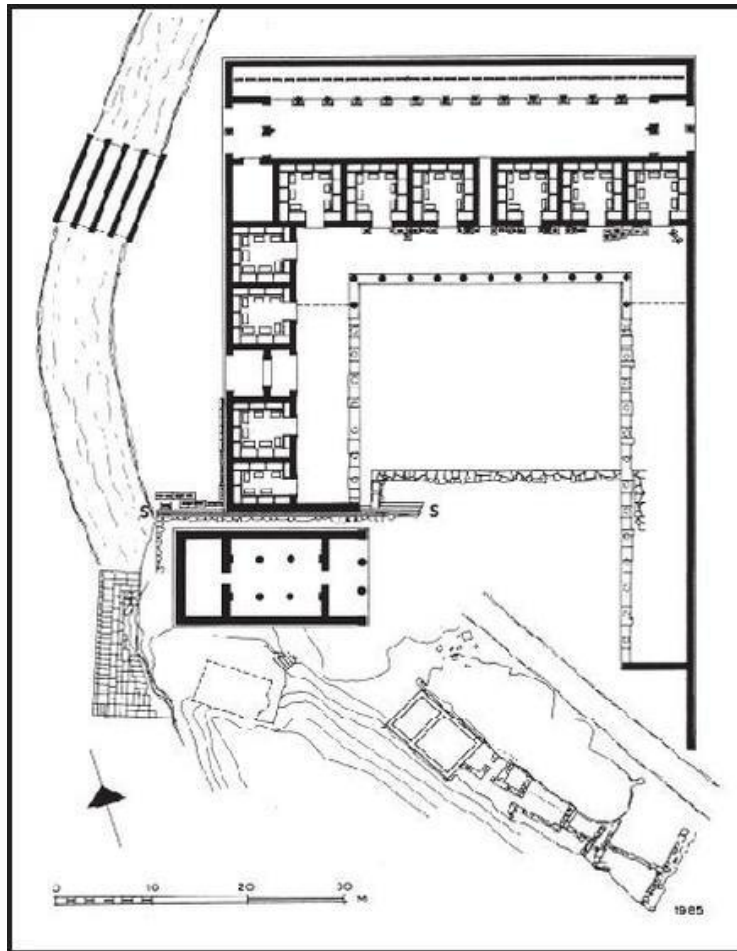


Fig. 3.6. Plan of the Sanctuary of Artemis at Brauron. (Nielsen 2009)

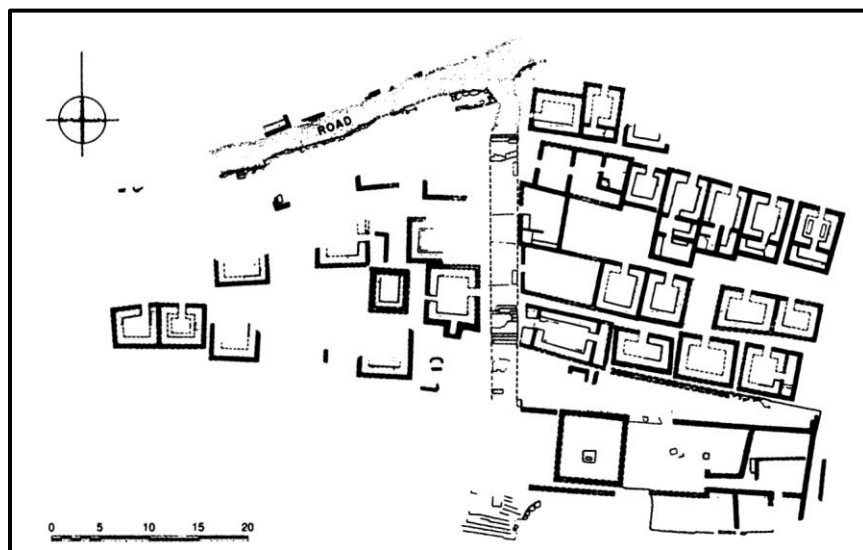


Fig. 3.7. Plan of dining facilities at the Sanctuary of Demeter and Kore, Corinth. (Mylonopoulos 2006)

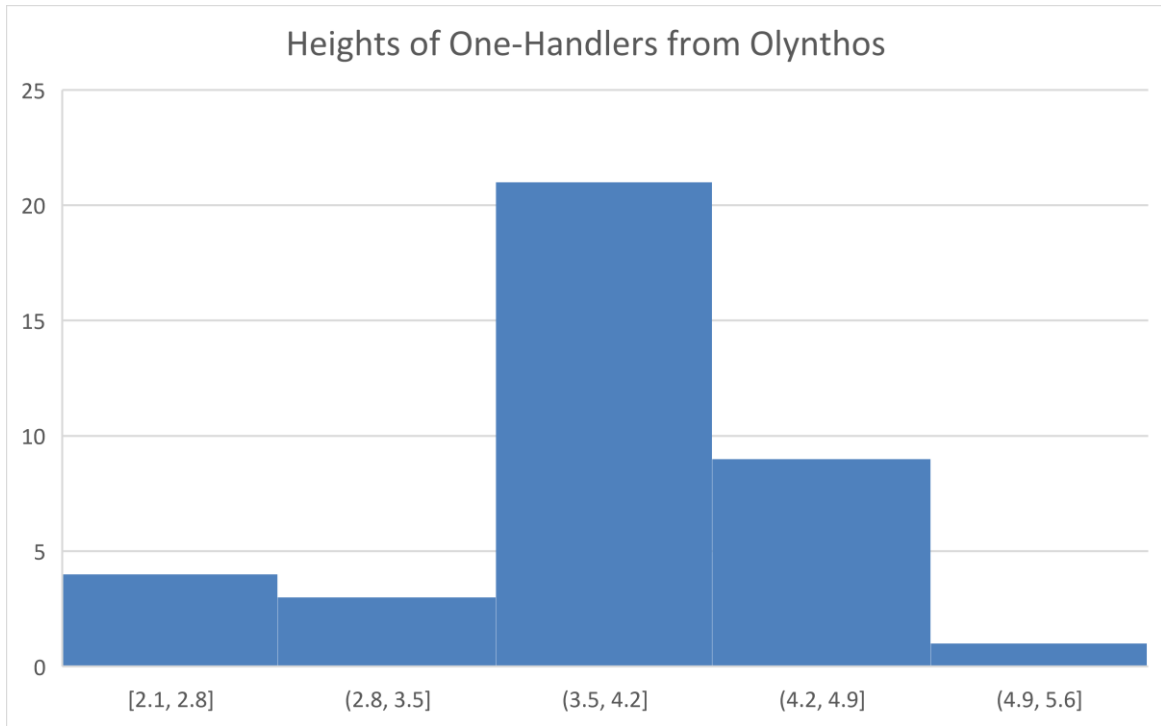


Fig. 4.1. Histogram of height measurements for one-handlers found at Olynthos.²

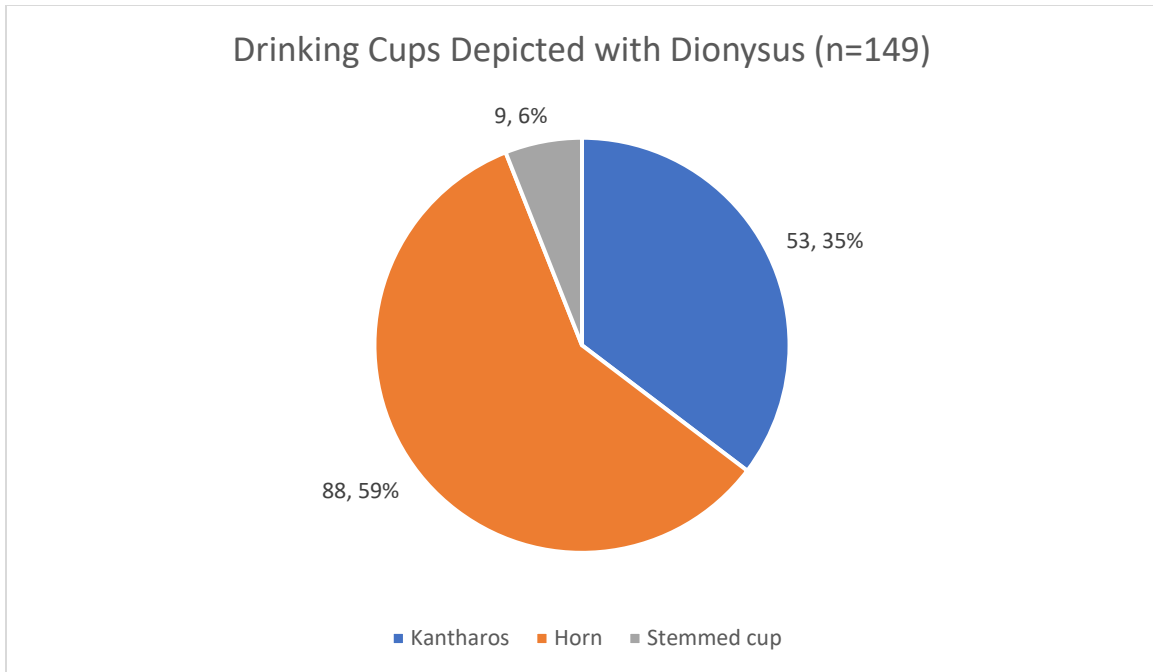


Fig. 4.3. Drinking cups depicted in Dionysiac scenes on Greek vases between 500 and 300 BCE.

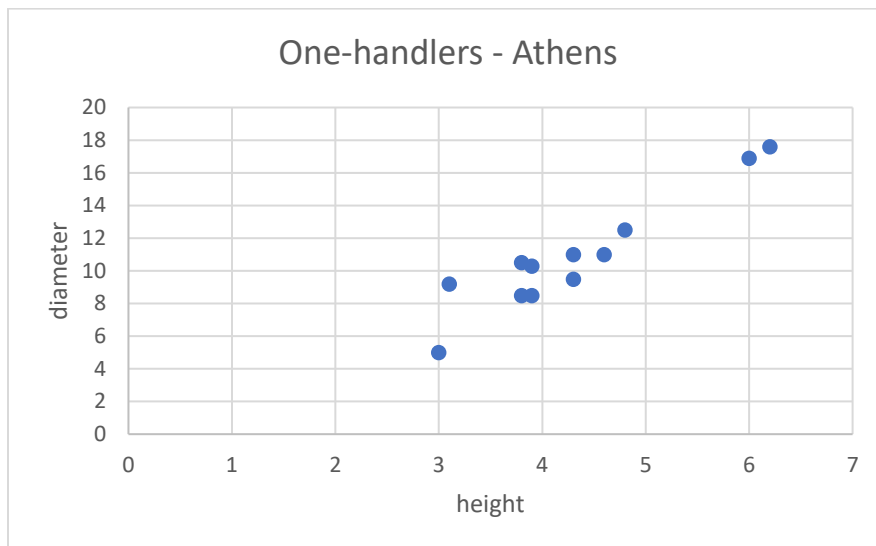


Fig. 4.6. Overall size distribution of one-handlers found at Athens.

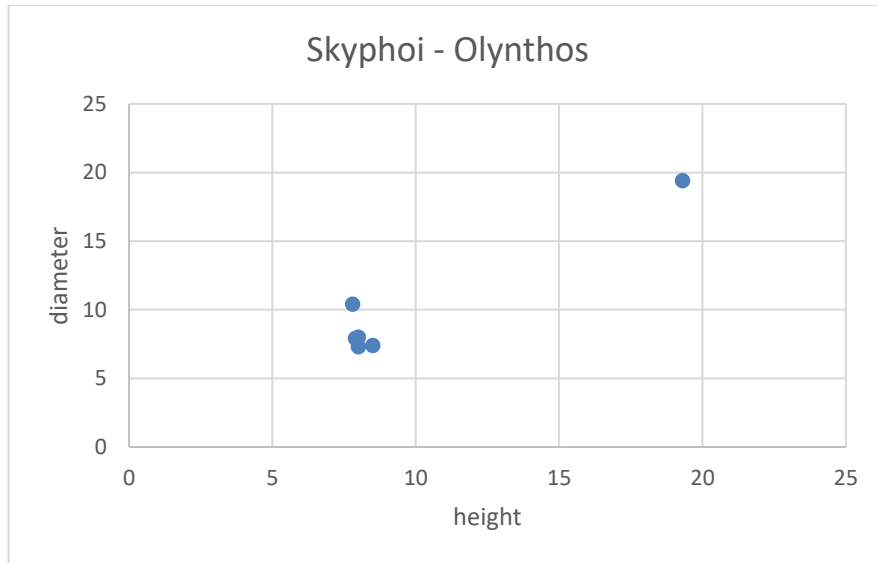


Fig. 4.7. Overall size distribution of skyphoi found at Olynthos.

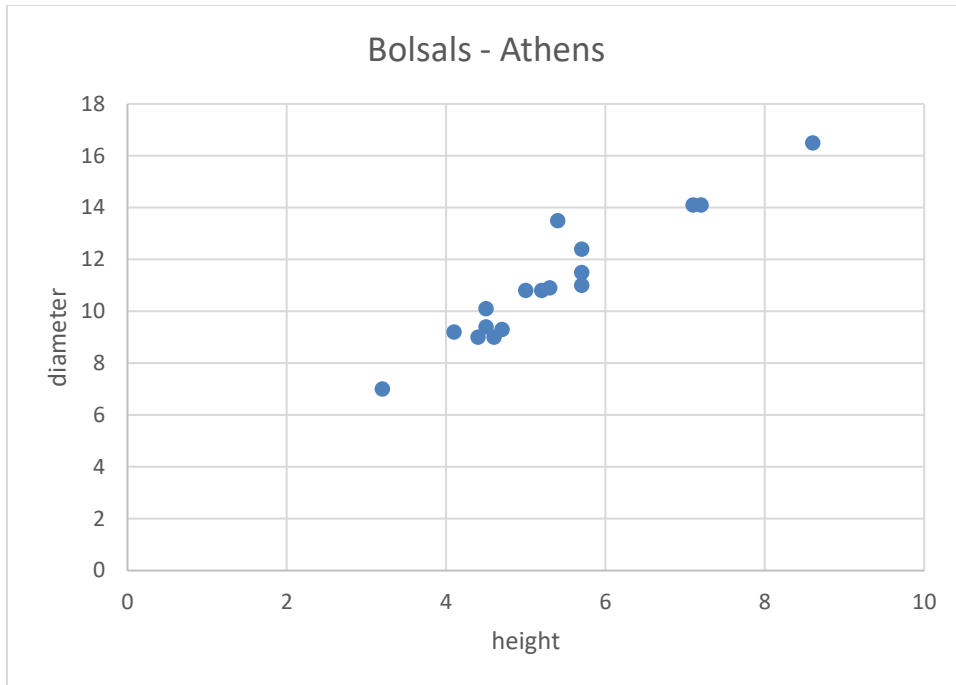


Fig. 4.9. Overall size distribution of bolsals found at Athens.

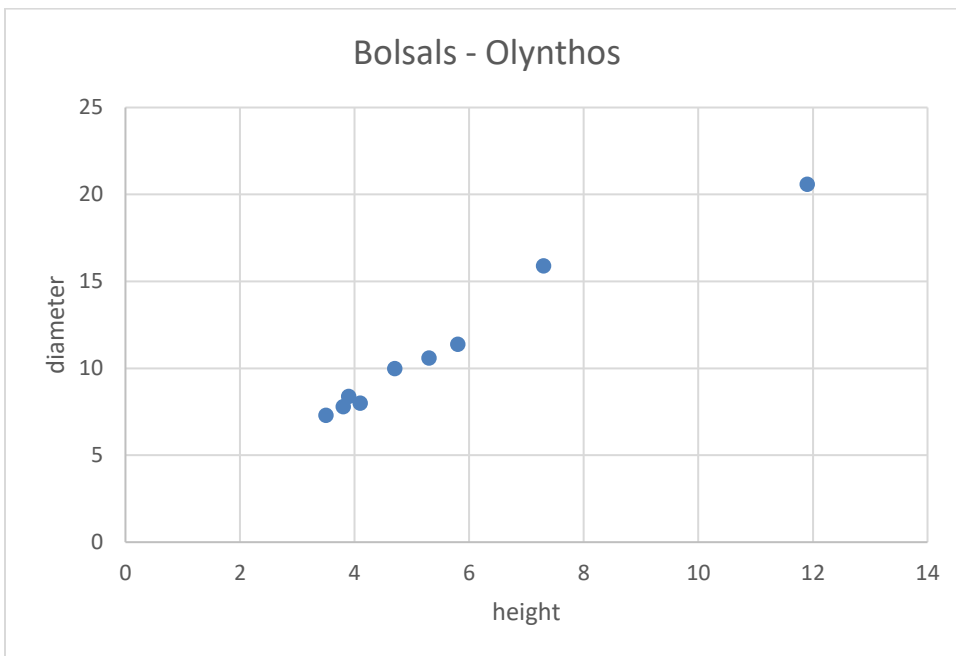


Fig. 4.10. Overall size distribution of bolsals found at Olynthos.

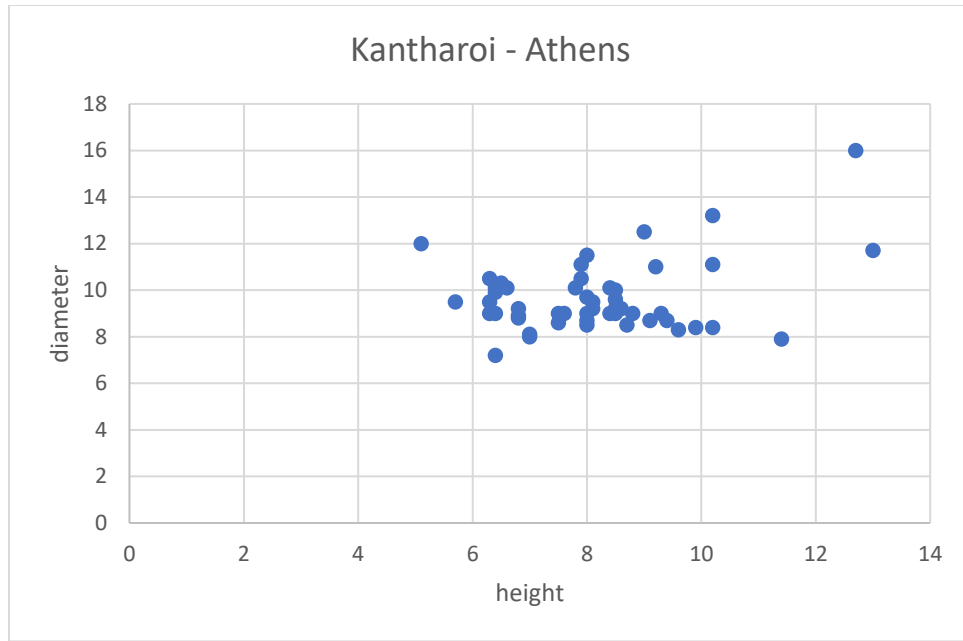


Fig. 4.11. Overall size distribution of kantharoi and cup-kantharoi found at Athens.

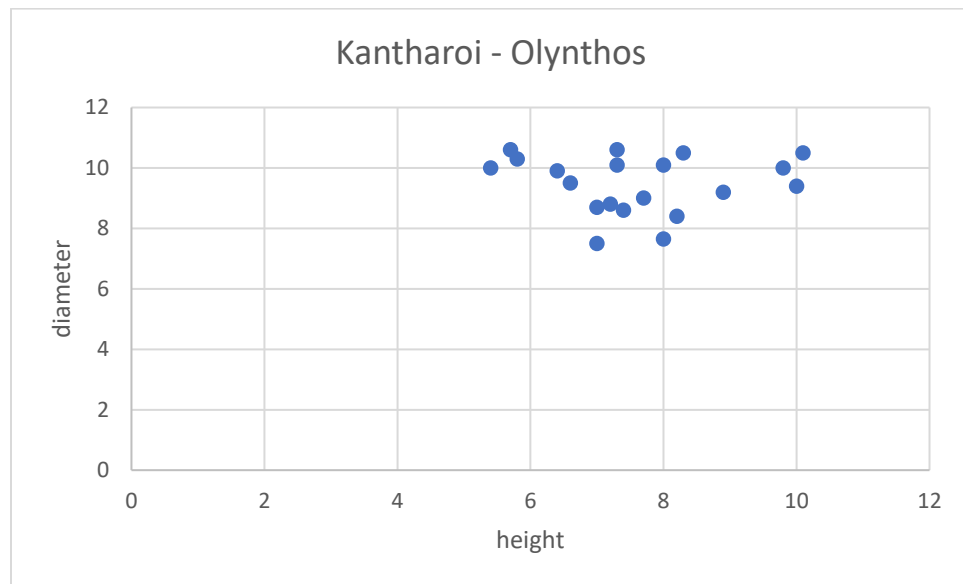


Fig. 4.12. Overall size distribution of kantharoi and cup-kantharoi found at Olynthos.

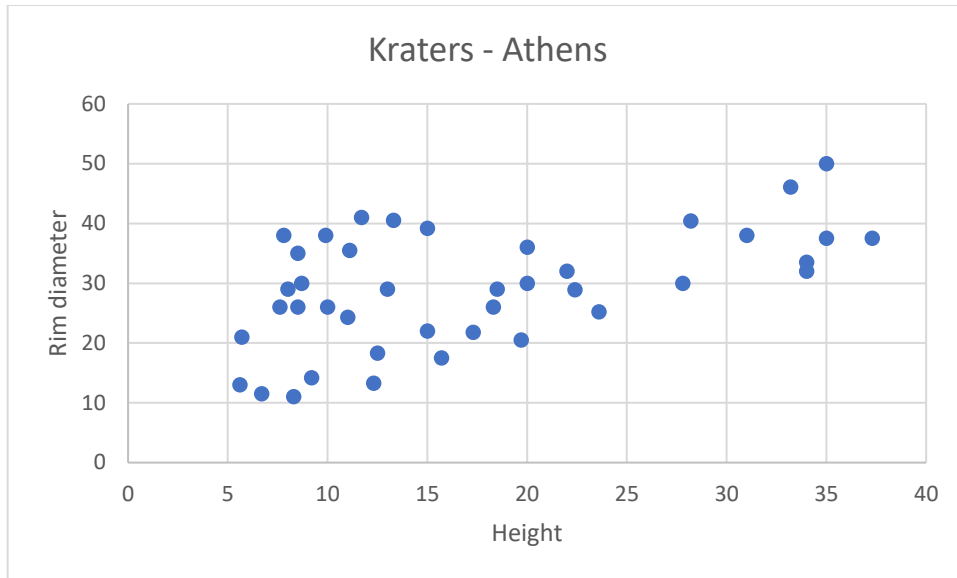


Fig. 4.13. Overall size distribution of kraters found at Athens.

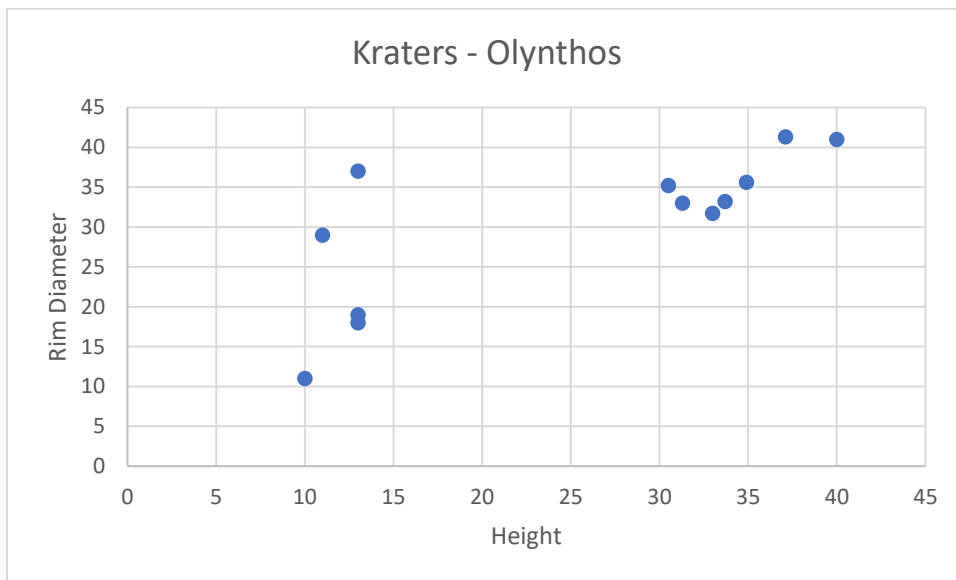


Fig. 4.14. Overall size distribution of kraters found at Olynthos.

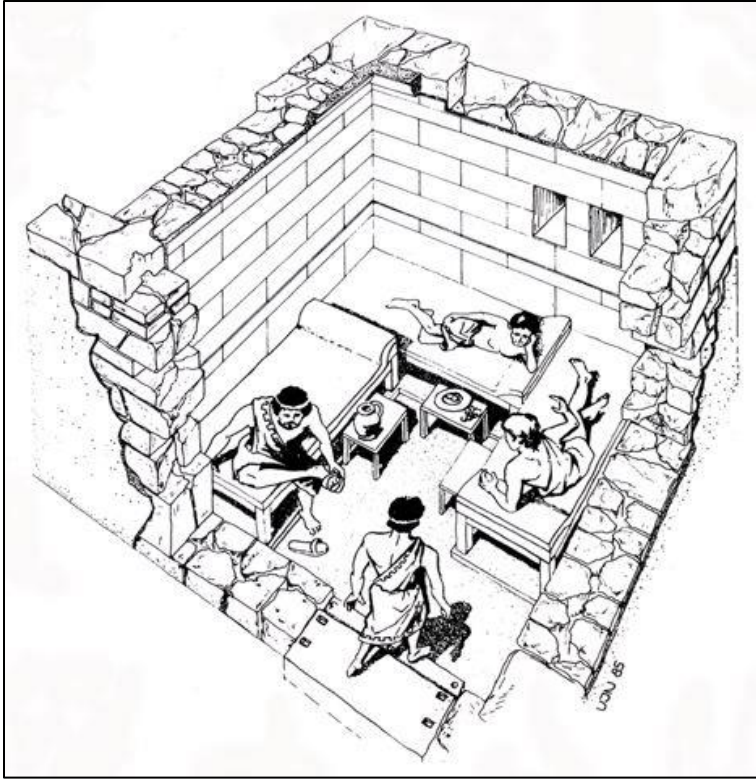


Fig. 5.1. Reconstruction of a Greek *andron* from Priene. (Kalostanou 2016, fig. 19)

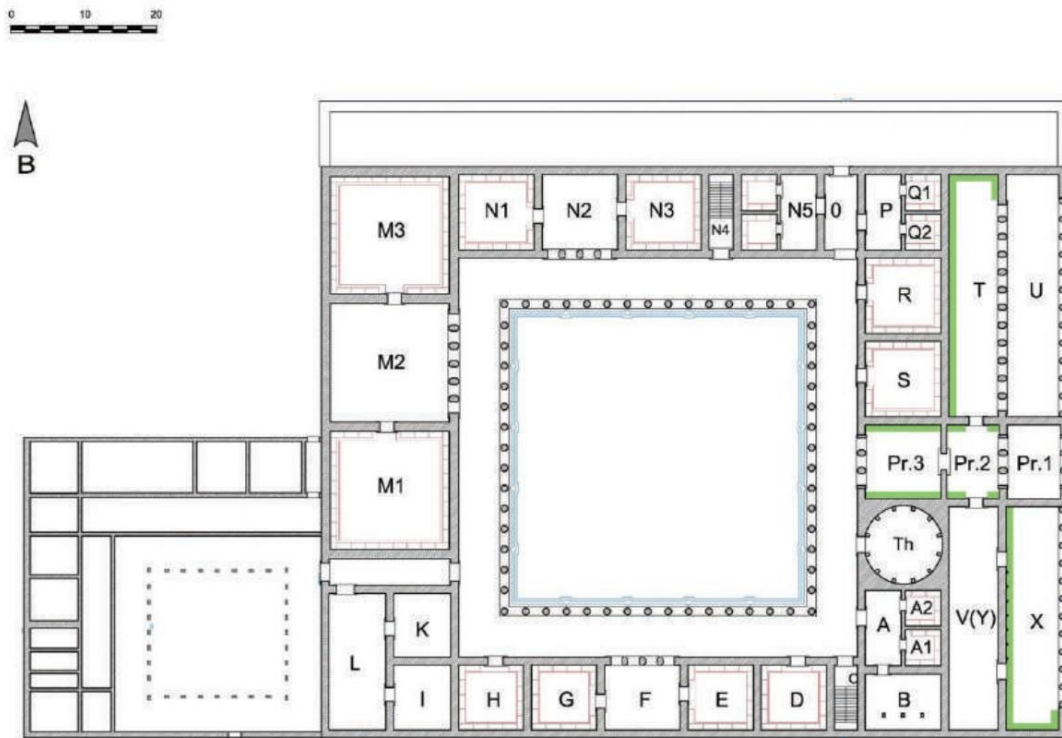


Fig. 5.2. Reconstructed plan of the main court of the palace at Vergina. (Kottaridi 2020, fig. 2)

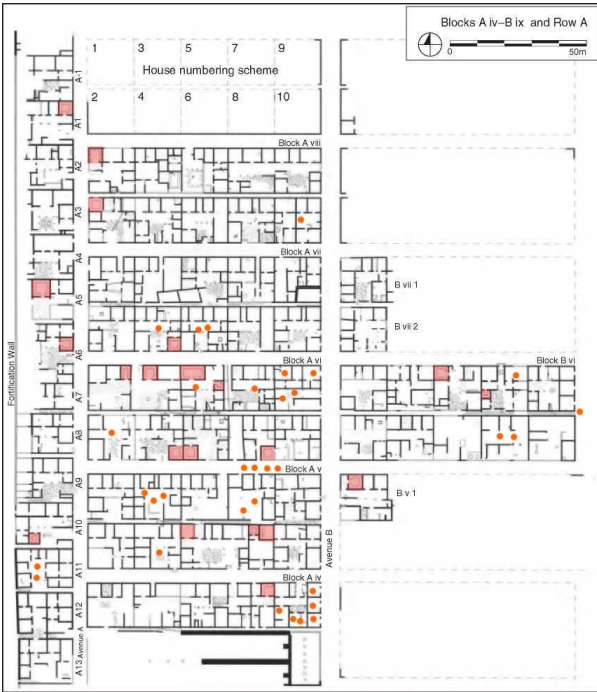


Fig. 5.6. Distribution map of one-handlers in the North Hill settlement of Olynthos. (Image by author)

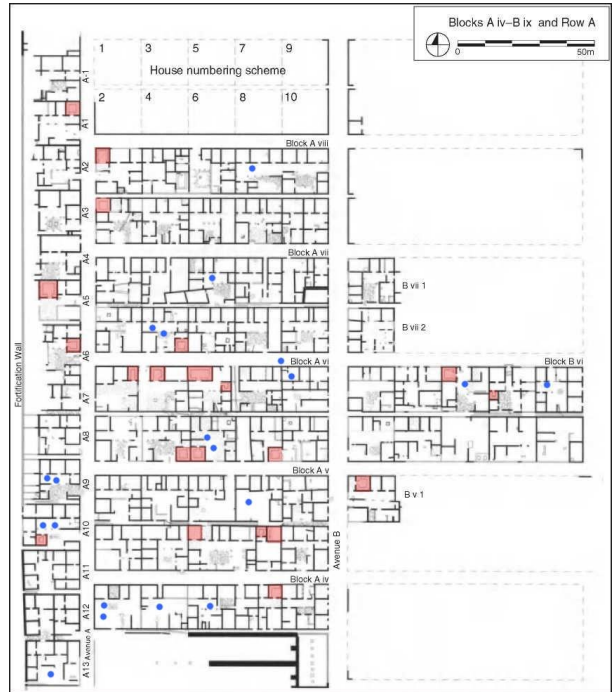


Fig. 5.7. Distribution map of kantharoi in the North Hill settlement of Olynthos. (Image by author)

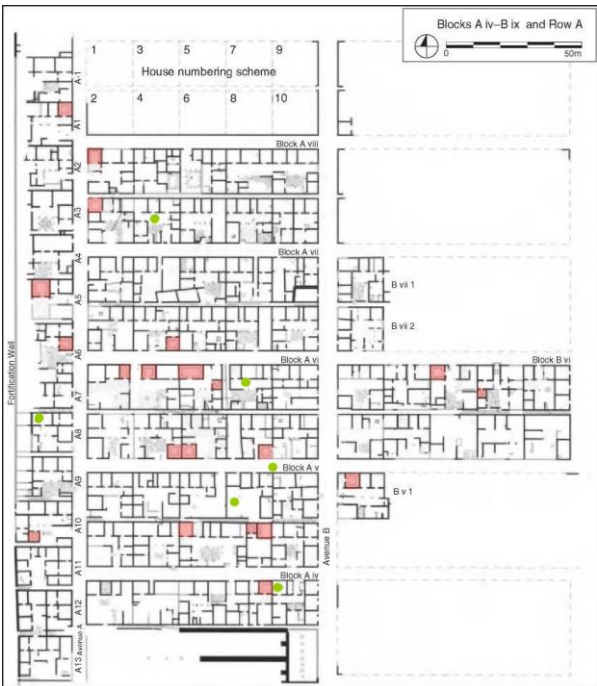


Fig. 5.8. Distribution of bolsals in the North Hill settlement of Olynthos. (Image by author)

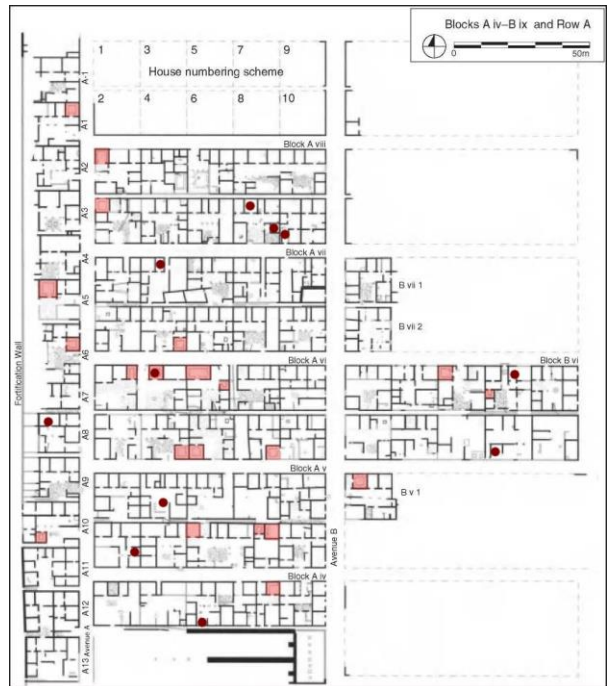


Fig. 5.9. Distribution map of kraters in the North Hill settlement at Olynthos. (Image by author)

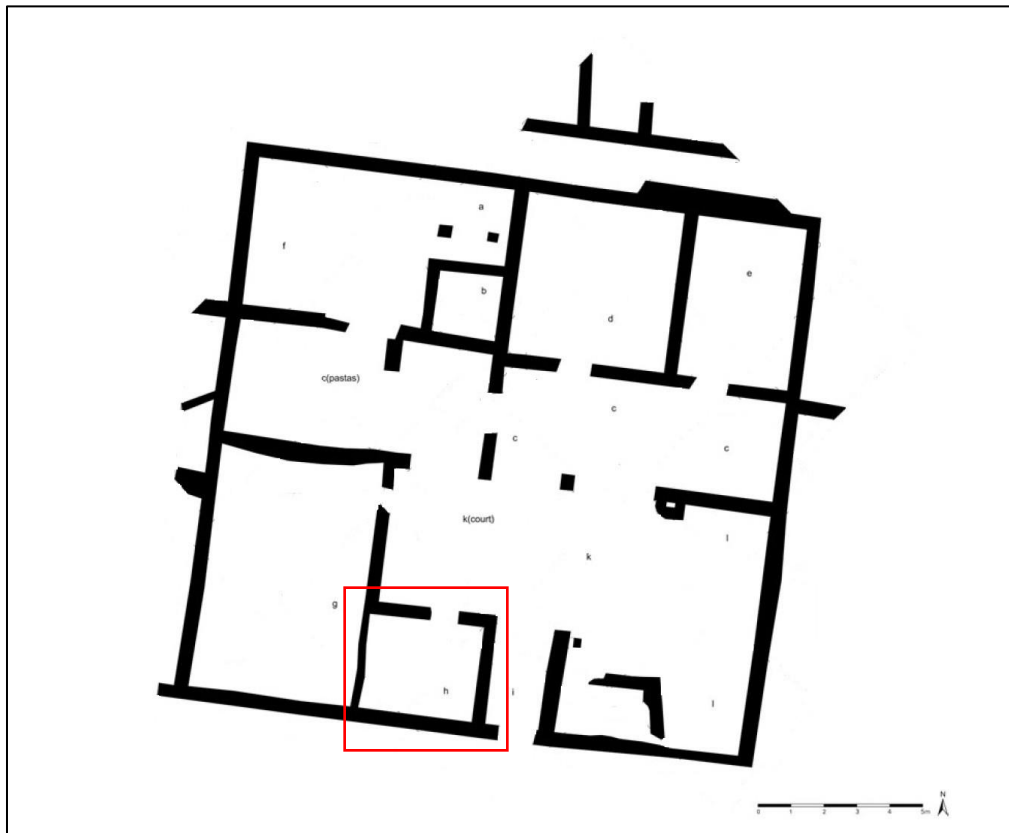


Fig. 5.18. Plan of house B ix 6 at Olynthos, with room h indicated. (After Nevett et al. 2020, fig. 18)

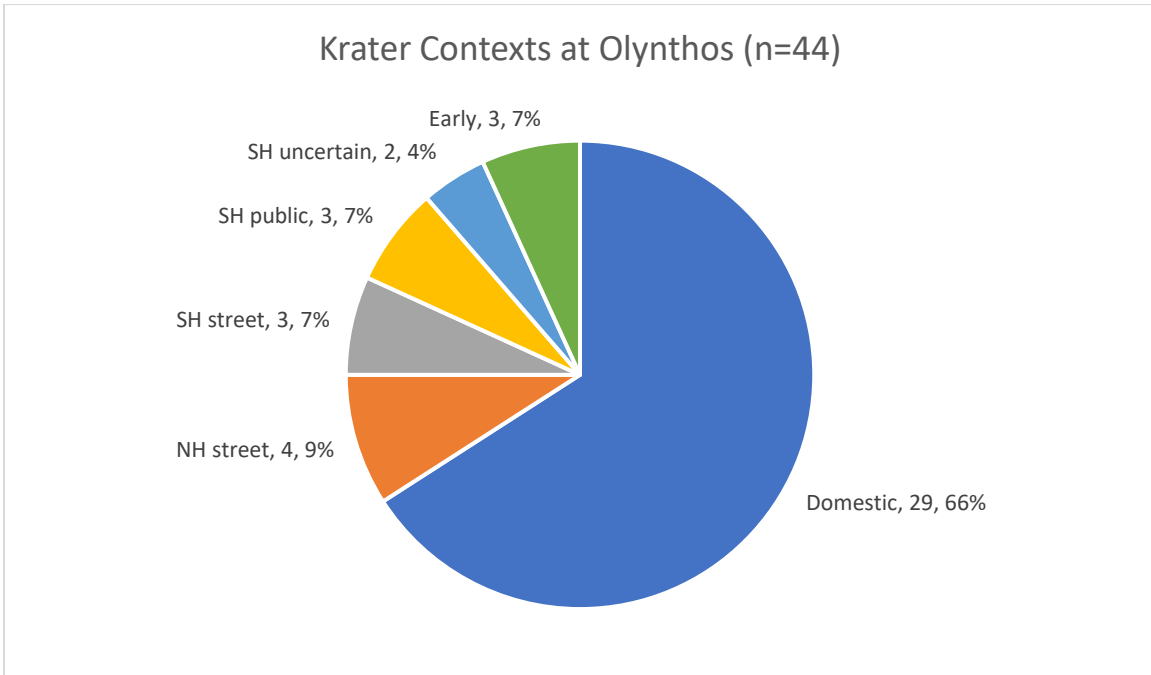


Fig. 6.1. Distribution of krater fragments at the site of Olynthos.

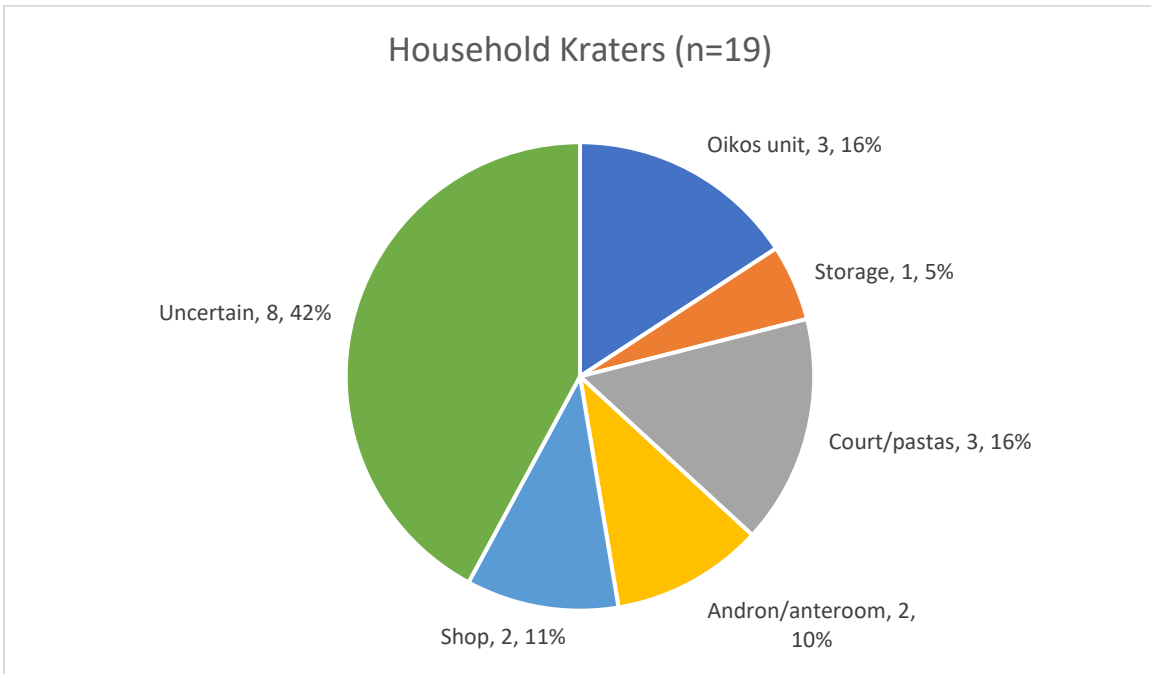


Fig. 6.2. Distribution of kraters found in houses at Olynthos by room. This chart excludes the ambiguous ‘rooms’ in Table 6.3 and street contexts.
