Based on a review of past studies of dental education, priority issues identified by the ADEA Board of Directors and ADEA Councils and key findings from past ADEA member surveys, we have developed an initial list of chronic and emerging challenges facing oral health education that we believe ADEA can impact over the next five to 10 years.

The *New Thinking for the New Century Survey* will help us prioritize the list of issues and provides you the opportunity to add your own ideas. We need and value your input.

We recognize there are numerous other issues and "macro disruptions" (e.g., future pandemics, climate change or political tribalism) that are not included on our initial list. We have chosen not to include them in this survey as it is unlikely that ADEA could have a significant impact on these issues in the near term.

Based on the survey results, the New Thinking for the New Century Steering Committee will identify up to three issues to focus on during the project's initial phase.

If we've learned anything over the past year, it is that the dental education community can come together to drive change and innovation when needed. For the future of the profession, *we need to do so now.*
