On 22 April 1985, a WHO Expert Committee on Drug Dependence was convened in Geneva, in part to advise WHO on recommendations regarding the need for and level of control of the substances described in the Symposium.

Their recommendations are described in a report (No. 729) from the WHO Technical Report Series. The Committee recommended the following levels of controls under the Convention on Psychotropic Substances.

In February 1986, the recommendations of WHO were considered by the United Nations Commission on Narcotic Drugs. They accepted all recommendations of WHO except for the level of control of cathine, which was changed to Schedule III.

Two substances, noted above, had been controlled at a previous meeting, and no change in their level of control was deemed necessary at the present time.
