## Scarlet Tanager's Nest

on July 2 a Scarlet Tanager's nest was found in the vicinity of the Biological Station, Douglas Lake, Cheboygan County, Michigan, on North Fistail Road by Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Messner, The nest site was about 15 yards east of the road, and one-fourth of a mile from the end, and the nest itself was located in a spruce about 10 feet up near the end of a horizontal branch. In it were one Scarlet Tanager and one Cowbird, both ready to leave the nest.

It seems characteristic of the male to be silent about the nest site, and to sing over a large territory. The male tanager often was observed singing along North Fistail Road in an area approximately one mile square. Its usual singing perch was in the top of an oak far from the nest. Since the territory is so extensive, and the male sings over such a large area, it is of little avail to attempt to locate the nest site by following a singing male bird. Probably, the best procedure is to find the female which remains in the vicinity of the nest, or a male which is silent.
