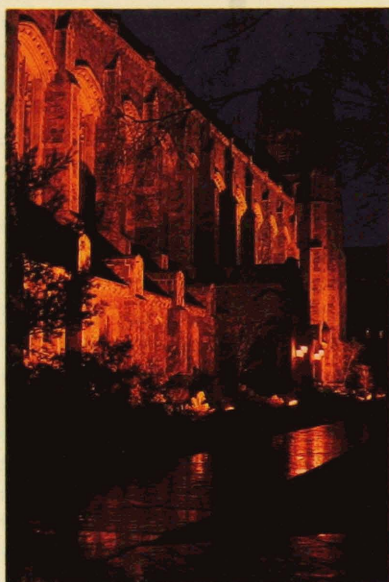

On the weekend of September 17-19, 1992, the Law School celebrated the public announcement of the \$75 million Law School Campaign. The Law School Campaign constitutes part of the University of Michigan's \$1 billion Campaign for Michigan, the largest fund-raising effort ever undertaken by a public university.

The Law Quadrangle, resplendent with a large blue and white tent, was the setting for the reception and announcement dinner on Thursday evening, September 17. Dean Lee Bollinger welcomed alumni and friends present and acknowledged those whose generous leadership gifts not only helped bring the two-year advance Nucleus Fund gift-and-pledge total to nearly \$20 million, but also gave the Law School confidence to undertake the \$75 million fund-raising challenge. After further words of welcome from University of Michigan President James J. Duderstadt and Provost Gilbert R. Whitaker, Law School Campaign National Chair Terrence A. Elkes, '58, spoke about the reasons for his own involvement as a volunteer and a donor in the Law School Campaign. Patricia M. Curtner, '78, Law School Fund National Chair, reminded guests of the important part all graduates play in supporting the University of Michigan Law School through annual giving and issued a challenge to all graduates to "Add another zero to your check!"

A highlight of the evening was the première of the Law School Campaign video, which vividly recalled the experiences of generations of Michigan Law School students and featured the Law Quadrangle in all its magnificence. William R. Jentes, '56, Chicago Major Gifts Chair, closed the dinner program with a toast recognizing the efforts of volunteers and wishing the Campaign success. A trumpet recital in the Law Library Reading Room brought the evening to a rousing conclusion.

The Law School is proud to announce this Campaign in which all alumni, faculty, and friends are invited to participate. The leadership gifts featured in the pages that follow illustrate the extraordinary generosity of Law School graduates and friends who have contributed to the Campaign's two-year advance Nucleus Fund effort. In addition to responding to reunion, bequest, and other special giving programs, all graduates have the opportunity to support the Campaign through their annual unrestricted gifts to the Law School Fund. All gifts and pledges received by the Law School between July 1, 1990 and June 30, 1997 will count toward the \$75 million goal and will receive both Law School Campaign and University Campaign for Michigan credit and recognition.

From the Dean

As a member of the University of Michigan Law School faculty for nearly two decades now, I have seen what makes an institution such as this great. It is not simply the large number of enormously talented people among both the faculty and the student body, though that is undeniably important. It is rather the desire inside so many of these individuals to excel—to be a better teacher, to write a more creative book or article, or, in the case of students, to improve in understanding and performance in the next class. In this kind of environment, in which the best teachers prepare most, the most creative minds work hardest to discover new perspectives, and the most talented among the students strive to improve, virtually everyone is affected, and the whole is greater than the sum of its parts.

When you are part of an institution for a long time, you also have the experience of seeing generation succeed generation. I remember vividly my first sight of Paul Kauper, whom I had read in college, stretched out across a sofa, his presence visually dominating the faculty room. As Dean, I now hear regularly from graduates about the power of his intellect and of others on the faculty during his generation.

My glimpse of Paul Kauper is my only access into that period of the School's history. But I do know, because they were among the senior faculty when I began teaching, those who followed—notably Allan Smith, Frank Allen, and Hart Wright, the only faculty member I have ever known who by some custom had acquired his own special chair at faculty meetings, from which he would regularly lecture the Dean on policy matters.

The generation of St. Antoine, Sandalow, Kamisar, Sax, and others followed, and they in turn brought in yet another group during the 1970s and 1980s—scholars and teachers of enormous intellectual range, who made the


Law School preeminent in interdisciplinary legal studies. And at this moment, the next generation is already formed and ready to succeed.

Seeing this succession makes one conscious not only of being part of a stream of extraordinary achievement but also of holding the institution in trust for those before and for those to follow. As Dean I have come to understand that the intellectual house of the Law School—which, in contrast to other law schools, has many rooms and a familial atmosphere—rests on a financial foundation. Today that foundation needs shoring up—and the roof needs to be raised. To this end, the Law School has undertaken a major fund-raising initiative.

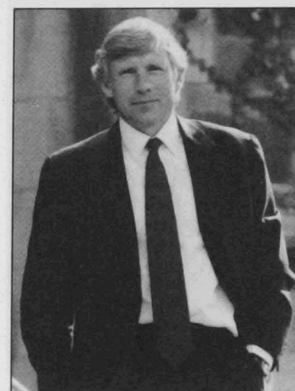

We are grateful for your endorsement and support.

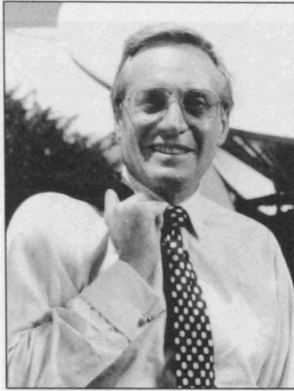

There are two kinds of learning. One fills our minds with facts, figures, and procedures. With any luck, we eventually understand something about what the world is and how it works.

This is not as simple as it sounds. In fact, it is so complex that, despite their best efforts, schools and colleges are still unable to deliver a complete basic education to every young person in America. Some students lose interest at an early age, and it is often hard to reignite their curiosity. If you feel the same sense of appreciation and gratitude, I hope that after you have applied our common heritage of critical analysis to the Law School's statement of its case, you will generously support its Campaign. The profession, and the world, will need the traditional skills of Michigan Law graduates for a long time to come.

I invite you to join me in investing in the future of the University of Michigan Law School and urge each of you to respond in the fullest way possible to the challenge of the Law School Campaign.

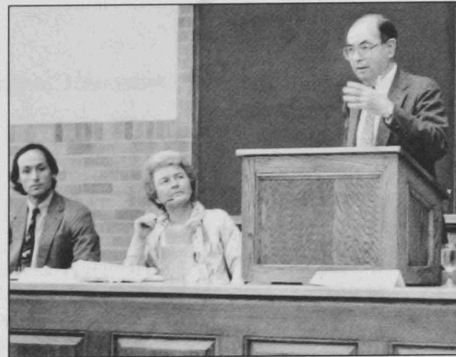

The Case for Private Support



Much of what the Law School is today is due to the generosity of a single donor: William W. Cook. Believing that lawyers of intelligence and integrity are essential to "the continuity of constitutional government and the perpetuity of the republic itself," he presented in 1922 the extraordinary gift of the Lawyers Club. Over the next several years, he contributed funding for additional structures to complete the Law Quadrangle. And after his death in 1930, Mr. Cook's will provided for the establishment of an endowed fund to support faculty research endeavors.

William Cook's generosity was unprecedented. At the time, his contribution of buildings and endowment was the largest gift in the history of legal education. It remains the most significant.

As our unequivocal response to the Cook challenge, the Law School Campaign seeks to raise \$75 million in external funding.

Building on that firm financial and architectural foundation, the University of Michigan Law School became one of the two or three most distinguished law schools in the world. Even today, 70 years later, the Law School retains that singular eminence, largely because of the Cook legacy and the enriching contributions of many others.

Abundant intellectual resources have been provided by a succession of outstanding deans, a faculty of exceptionally talented scholars, and generations of uncommonly bright students. Financial resources have come from the State of Michigan, student tuition and fees, endowment income, and the philanthropy of alumni and friends.

Operating expenses have risen dramatically. The demands on the Law School's budget—whether for scholarships, faculty salaries and research support, or library acquisitions—far exceed the purchasing power of available funds.

Michigan's economy has been less than vibrant for some time, and recent annual allocations of state funding have failed to keep pace with inflation and rapidly rising costs. In fiscal 1991, Michigan's higher education appropriation per full-time student ranked 31st in the nation.

As state support has met fewer of our needs, tuition increases have been unavoidable. In the last 12 years alone, Law School tuition for all students has more than tripled.

With the dramatic rise in operating costs, the steady decline in state support, and tuition now at the upper limit, the University of Michigan Law School, more than ever, must turn to private support to meet its needs.

William Cook left us a dual legacy. He gave us the opportunity to build "a great centre of legal education and of jurisprudence." With his help, and the dedication of all who have taught, studied, and thought in the Law Quadrangle, that goal has been achieved. He also left us an enduring challenge: to maintain and strengthen this remarkable institution.

For most of its history, the Law School's financial resources have been sufficient to support its world-class legal education and research programs. That is no longer true.

The majority of the new funds generated by the Campaign will be allocated to doubling the Law School's total endowment. This is an extraordinarily ambitious goal, but it is absolutely necessary if we are to assure adequate investment in the Law School's long-term future.

The Campaign also seeks significantly higher levels of unrestricted annual gifts through the Law School Fund and encourages new testamentary commitments.

The Law School Campaign's \$75 million goal derives from the traditional strengths of the institution — faculty, students, and facilities — and offers an historic opportunity for alumni and friends to strengthen the Law School's assets for the next century.

The University of Michigan Law School is an unusual institution—unique, in fact, in the history of American legal education. It is the best of the public law schools, and it ranks with the finest of the private law schools.

As part of the University of Michigan, it enjoys unparalleled opportunities for collaboration with world-class scholars in every academic discipline. As a distinct entity, it has always been a law school of the highest order, widely regarded with admiration, respect, and deep affection.

The Law School's current sources of income can no longer support its worldwide renown. Excellence is expensive. Voluntary private support, in recognition of the Law School's exemplary service to past, present, and future generations of the legal profession and the larger society, must now extend the vision of the Law School's founders and leaders.

Faculty Support—\$15 million



The Law School has traditionally retained a unique faculty of excellent teachers and scholars. But competition for the finest legal minds intensifies year by year, and Michigan must keep pace with peer institutions in attracting and retaining the best. Additional named professorships will protect and extend the Law School's outstanding faculty resources.

The faculty's research productivity also depends on greater budgeting flexibility. The Cook Endowment's historic support for sabbatical leaves, student assistants, and research materials sets a fine precedent for alumni support of faculty endeavors. Research costs have dramatically increased, though, and the Law School faculty has grown, so the Cook fund must now be augmented with income from new endowment for research.

Kirkland & Ellis Endowed Professorship

The University of Michigan Law School alumni partners of the Chicago-based national law firm of Kirkland & Ellis, together with the Kirkland & Ellis Foundation, have enthusiastically pledged \$1.2 million to fund the Kirkland & Ellis Chair at the Law School.

The Michigan Law School alumni partners at the firm, Daniel W. Vittum, Jr., '64, William R. Jentes, '56, Karl E. Lutz, '75, James M. Amend, '67, Bruce A. Featherstone, '77, Garrett B. Johnson, '71, and Alexander F. MacKinnon, '81, were pleased to make generous individual commitments as a gesture of appreciation for their Law School education. To recognize the significant contributions of Michigan Law School graduates at Kirkland & Ellis, the Kirkland & Ellis Foundation will match the gifts of these alumni and complete the funding for this professorship.

We are grateful to the University of Michigan Law School for what it provides to its students and to the legal community. We are very pleased to be able to make a significant contribution that recognizes Michigan's important tradition of faculty excellence.

Elkes Endowed Professorship

Terrence A. Elkes, Law School National Campaign Chair, and his wife Ruth have pledged \$1 million combined with a new bequest commitment of \$1 million to establish the Terrence A. and Ruth F. Elkes Chair.

"Among the building blocks that make a great Law School, an outstanding student body and faculty are its foundation. They exist and function in a symbiotic relationship," commented Elkes. "In 1987 my wife and I created a scholarship fund which has served to attract and keep our students. We feel equally privileged today to do the same for our faculty."

Elkes, the managing partner of Apollo Partners Ltd., an investment firm dealing in entertainment and media related properties has been involved with the television and entertainment industries since 1972. His dedication as National Campaign Chair and his extraordinary financial support of the Law School reflect his commitment to extending Michigan's first-rate legal education for future generations.

*J*ohn Butler Schwemm Endowed Fund

By creating the John Butler Schwemm Endowed Fund to promote the teaching of ethics and professional and individual responsibility at the Michigan Law School, Jack Schwemm, '59, and his wife Nancy hope they can make a difference in the training of future generations of lawyers. "Students need to struggle with what it means to have duties and responsibilities, with a consideration of what's right and proper. They need to arrive at a clear understanding of what the principles of honesty and fairness and justice mean."

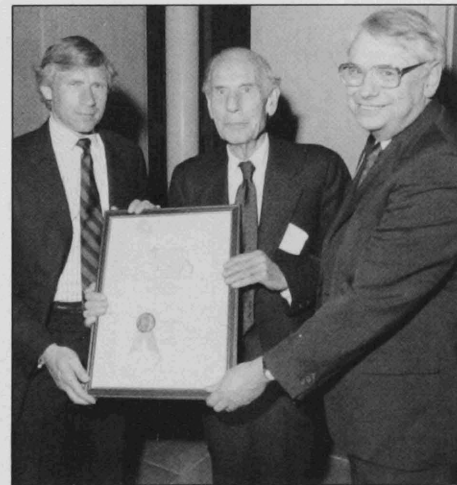
The Schwemm Fund, established with a \$500,000 gift, will support the teaching of a course each year at the Law School, designed to encourage an appreciation of the importance of ethical principles and of individual and professional responsibility in the practice of law.

The Schwemms' interest in the teaching of ethics at the Law School stems from their strong concern for the ethical conduct of business. Schwemm, a member of the Committee of Visitors and the Law School's Chicago Major Gifts Committee, is the retired chairman and chief executive officer of R.R. Donnelley and Sons, the nation's largest commercial printing company, where he continues to serve as a consultant.

*T*he Louis and Myrtle Moskowitz Research Professorship

The Louis and Myrtle Moskowitz Research Professorship in Business and Law was established with a pledge of \$750,000 from Republic National Bank of New York to honor the chairman of its Executive Committee, Louis Moskowitz, and the memory of his wife Myrtle Moskowitz. The Moskowitz Professorship will provide a faculty member from the Law School and the School of Business Administration, on a rotating basis, a one-semester leave from all teaching and administrative responsibilities to pursue research in an area of law, economics and finance. Every third year, in lieu of the designation of a Moskowitz Professor, a forum or lecture series may be offered.

Speaking on behalf of Republic National Bank, Walter H. Weiner, '53, chairman and chief executive officer, said, "We are delighted to honor Louis and Myrtle Moskowitz through this partnership with the University of Michigan." Only a few months after the gift was announced, Louis Moskowitz passed away. The fund named in his honor will keep the memory of his exemplary service and generosity alive. Over time, the Fund will sponsor important and useful research which will bring honor and visibility to the faculty recipients, the Moskowitz family, and Republic Bank of New York.



Bequest Establishes Frank G. Millard Professorship

A \$1.2 million gift from the estate of Dorothy E. Millard has endowed the Frank G. Millard Professorship of Law. "By his wide variety of acts of public service, Frank Millard exemplified the public character of law as a profession," said Dean Lee Bollinger in announcing the establishment of the chair. "His life in the law added distinction to the profession and to his school."

Millard served as attorney general for the State of Michigan from 1950 to 1954. In 1955 he was appointed general counsel of the Department of the Army and remained in Washington, D.C., until 1961, when he returned to Michigan and was elected a delegate to the Michigan State Constitutional Convention.

Frank Gurnee Millard (1897-1976), a native of Corunna, Michigan, earned his degree from the Law School in 1916. He practiced law in Flint and was active in the Genesee County Republican Party.



Benedum Foundation Faculty Research Endowment

With a grant of \$500,000, the trustees of the Benedum Foundation of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, have established the Claude Worthington Benedum Faculty Research Endowment Fund to support new research initiatives.

The Benedum Foundation has over the past three decades been a generous benefactor of the Law School, helping to build its research and scholarship base with commitments to the International and Comparative Law Program and to the construction of the Allan and Alene Smith Law Library Addition in 1977.

Henry A. Bergstrom, '35, a trustee of the Benedum Foundation from 1959 to 1991, noted that Michael Benedum, the creator of the foundation and a pioneer "wildcatter" in the developing oil and gas industry, relied largely on the Michigan lawyers who for more than eighty years "wrote the law" in the exploration for and production of oil and gas.

Paul Jenkins, '57, president of the Benedum Foundation, hopes the grant will serve as an incentive to other potential donors as the Law School launches its Campaign. Excited about Benedum's commitment, he stressed that "an increase in endowment is absolutely essential if Michigan is to remain in the front rank of leading law schools."

Endowed Student Support—\$15 million



The Law School must continue to enroll the very best students to preserve its status among the finest institutions of legal education. The presence of unusually talented students makes the Law School a more dynamic academic environment. Their intellectual curiosity and enthusiasm generate new ideas, stimulate better teaching and research, and enliven the Law School community.

Merit scholarships assist the Law School in recruiting these exceptional students who might consider other schools with more competitive scholarship programs. Merit scholarships also reward students for the values of academic excellence and hard work that are among the essential qualities of a superior legal education. Though Michigan has had a modest merit scholarship program for some years, the Law School needs to increase its resources in order to compete for these students of exceptional ability.

Jentes Scholarships Attract Top Students to Michigan

William R. Jentes, '56, chair of the Law School's Chicago Major Gifts Committee, and his wife Janet have established a \$1.5 million endowed merit scholarship fund to help the Law School to attract students of the highest calibre.

Jentes himself was exactly the type of student the fund will bring to Michigan. A member of Phi Beta Kappa and the Order of the Coif, Jentes received a Fulbright Scholarship and spent the year after his graduation from Michigan studying comparative law at the University of Grenoble in France.

Jentes is now a principal partner with Kirkland & Ellis, where he has practiced for 35 years, and was inducted into the American College of Trial Lawyers in 1989. In addition to his volunteer activities for the School, he taught a trial practice class at the Law School in the fall of 1991.



It was really nice to meet Mr. Jentes and to tell him that not having to work for tuition during the school year has been wonderful. It allows me to focus on my studies, which are really important to me. I can put my financial resources elsewhere, like summer study. Right now, I'm looking into taking classes in Japan next summer, because I want to go into international law.

Law School is stressful enough without having to think about money. Of course, when we get opportunities like this as students, we will certainly give to the Law School when we are in a position to do so, to give others similar opportunities.

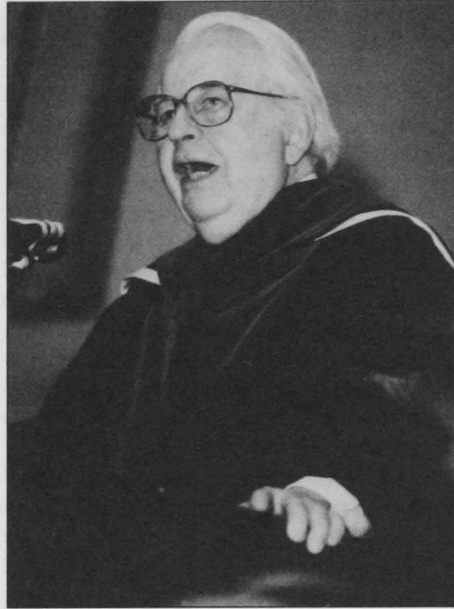

Pickering Scholarship Encourages
Public Service Practice

On the occasion of the 30th anniversary of its founding, Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering, a Washington, D.C., law firm celebrated for its regulatory and legislative practice, pledged \$500,000 to endow a scholarship fund at the University of Michigan Law School. The endowment honors named partner and founder John H. Pickering, '40.

Pickering has enjoyed a distinguished career of public service, pro bono and professional practice. He was guest speaker at the Law School commencement on May 10, 1992, and served as the Helen L. De Roy Fellow at the School in March, 1984. He is a member of the Committee of Visitors and was chair of the Law School's Development Committee to raise funds for the Allan and Alene Smith Library Addition. In 1979, the University honored him with the Outstanding Achievement Award for service to the University.

The Pickering Scholarship will provide annual tuition for one or more students. Friends of Mr. Pickering have augmented the impact of the fund with contributions in his honor. Selection of the Pickering Scholars will be based on financial need, academic excellence, and a student's pro bono and public service record. Those selected, like members of the firm of Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering, must be committed to dedicating at least 10 percent of their professional efforts to pro bono work or public service activities.



The Michigan faculty help you develop original thoughts and test them. A legal education that isn't teaching you where the edges of the law are is just a bar exam course. Too many qualified students of limited means are discouraged by the high cost of law school. The Law School's program of need-based scholarships must be augmented in order to make a Michigan legal education accessible to the best students of all backgrounds, regardless of their ability to pay. The Law School needs their leavening diversity, and society needs their skills.

Debt management programs for graduates who have chosen public service careers are also important. Every year, fewer Michigan graduates enter not-for-profit practice. Effective aid in dealing with the heavy burden of debt many students accrue can help to reverse this trend.

Graduates have traditionally set high standards for assisting students at the Law School. Many students have benefitted from the generosity of Frederick L. Leckie, S.K. Yee, George E. and Elizabeth S. Sperling, Thomas J. Donnelly, William and Lois Halliday, and many others. The Law School Campaign now turns to the School's graduates to build on that tradition of student support with \$15 million in new endowment.



Japanese Legal Studies

With its superb comparative legal studies program and a library collection of more than 10,000 Japanese legal texts, the Law School has long attracted Japanese scholars. Since 1878, the Law School has hosted numerous students and distinguished visitors from the Japanese legal community. The School's Japanese alumni number over 100, and have included members of the Japanese Supreme Court, officials in the Ministry of Justice, faculty at leading Japanese universities, and attorneys at leading Japanese law firms.

As the U.S. and Japanese economies become more interdependent, the Law School has the opportunity to become the foremost center for cross-cultural research on Japanese and American legal issues. Additional funding for Japanese Legal Studies will support international research fellowships for faculty and students, further expansion of Michigan's library resources in Japanese law, and an enhanced program of lectures, conferences, and faculty exchange.

The International Law Program

The University of Michigan Law School has been a leader in international legal studies since the mid-nineteenth century, with the extraordinary breadth of the international law curriculum, the global interests of the faculty, and the fine international collections in the Law Library. These assets are enhanced by the large number of distinguished foreign visitors and students, and the numerous opportunities for faculty exchange and student externships abroad. Preparing the next generation of lawyers for an increasingly interdependent world is among the Law School's highest priorities.

Program Support—\$15 million

Nippon Life Promotes Japanese Legal Studies

With a gift of \$1.2 million, Nippon Life Insurance Company has established the Nippon Professorship at the Law School.

Nippon Life established the endowment in recognition of the mutual desire of Nippon Life and the Law School to increase opportunities for contact between Japanese and American teachers, scholars, and students. Law Professor Whitmore Gray, who has been active in Japanese legal studies for over twenty years, notes that "We have had a long tradition of having Japanese students here at the Law School, and our U. S. students have become increasingly interested in Japan."

The Nippon Professorship will provide for an enhanced program of faculty exchange, research grants to faculty and research assistants working on issues of Japanese law, and additions to the Law Library's collection of Japanese legal materials. In the past, teachers from Japan have taught courses in Japanese criminal law, international litigation, and international trade. The Law School will benefit significantly from Nippon Life's commitment to further such interaction.



Sumitomo Bank Ltd. of Japan

A \$500,000 gift from Sumitomo Bank Ltd. of Japan will further strengthen the study of Japanese law at the Michigan Law School. The gift was presented by Kensuke Hotta, director and general manager of the Sumitomo New York branch, and Masayuki Oku, joint general manager of the Sumitomo New York branch and Michigan LL.M. '75.

"It is my hope that this contribution will enhance the study and understanding of the Japanese legal system and that your institution will become a center of Japanese law study in the United States," wrote Sumitomo president Sotou Tatsume to Dean Lee Bollinger. He continued, "I also hope that this is the beginning of a long and fruitful relationship between your law school and Sumitomo."



Japan Foundation Alumni Raise Funds for Japanese Legal Studies

In 1989, the Japanese alumni of Michigan Law School formed an Alumni Club, based in Tokyo. In addition to strengthening their ties with each other, the Club has renewed their ties with the School. They have undertaken several fund-raising initiatives, assisted in securing the leadership gifts from Nippon and Sumitomo, and have as individuals given the Law School a total of \$150,000 through the Japan Foundation. Their activity on behalf of the Law School will continue to extend the School's ties with Japan and support for Japanese Legal Studies at the Law School.

The necessity for and importance of research leading to an understanding of Japanese law by America's premiere educational institutions are growing rapidly. The University of Michigan Law School has undertaken to deepen its understanding of and research into Japanese law, to become a major center for research in Japanese law in the United States, and to establish an epoch-making Japanese law research program.

Knight Foundation Funds Fellowship for Legal Journalist

A gift from the Knight Foundation of Miami, Florida, will help endow a permanent fellowship in the Michigan Journalism Program for a journalist pursuing studies in law and legal issues. Of an overall award of \$850,000 from the Knight Foundation, \$375,000 was allocated for law.

David Hanners, special projects writer for the *Dallas Morning News*, is the current law Journalism Fellow studying the media and capital punishment.

"The Michigan Journalism Program has attracted quality journalists from some of the best news organizations in the nation and given them an educational experience that has often been a catalyst in their careers," says Knight Foundation Vice President James D. Spaniolo, '75.

Established in 1950 by John S. and James L. Knight, the Knight Foundation is one of the nation's largest private foundations. It makes national grants in journalism, higher education and the fields of arts and culture.



Law Library

Funds raised to support the Law Library will address three major needs: acquisitions, preservation, and computerization. The Library purchases about 15,000 new volumes each year; with the meteoric rise of book prices in the last decade, the Library needs new funding in order to maintain its collections. Because many of the 700,000 volumes in the library are printed on acidic paper, they are at risk and must be replaced or protected. To broaden access to its world renowned collections, the Law Library has undertaken a comprehensive automation project. This will help contain costs by making more effective use of current resources. It will also facilitate the work of faculty, students, and the legal community, all of whom depend on the Law Library.

The Clinical Law Programs

The Clinical Law Program and Child Advocacy Law Clinic are immensely popular with students, as are the Women and the Law Clinic, and Environmental Law.

Students are often turned away from the clinical experiences they seek because of a shortage of faculty supervisors. Increased support for the Clinical Law Programs will reinforce the Law School's commitment to public interest work and increase students' access to, and interest in, the full range of practice options.

Michigan's outstanding clinical law programs could be elevated to national stature with additional funding for faculty support.

Discretionary Endowment



Unrestricted endowment gifts are in many ways the most valuable, as they allow the School to allocate funds where the need is greatest. To have the flexibility to fund new research initiatives as they arise, to take advantage of opportunities for guest lectures and seminars on legal issues of the moment, to enable students to take on special projects: these are benefits of unrestricted endowment income. An unrestricted endowment gift is an extraordinary vote of confidence in the Law School and its leadership.

"The long-term impact of a substantial endowment base generating discretionary funds for the School is truly significant. These funds are especially valuable in that they generate funds for unforeseen but meritorious student and faculty opportunities as they arise."

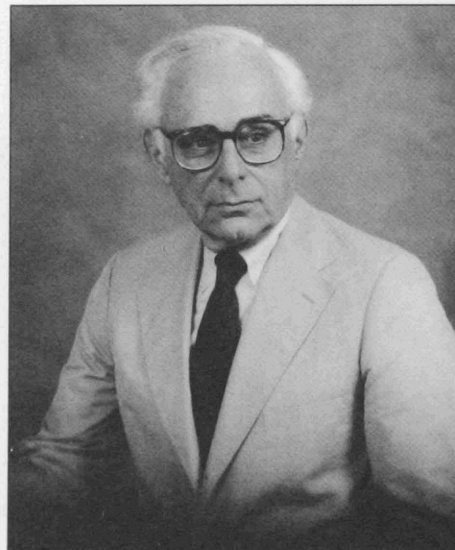

U.S. District Court Judge Avern L. Cohn Establishes Dean's Discretionary Fund

"The very foundation of my professional life" is how U.S. District Court Judge Avern Cohn, '49, describes his University of Michigan Law School years. Without Michigan, he says, he could not have succeeded at the practice of law for 30 years nor attained the prestigious federal judgeship he has held since 1979.

Judge Cohn practiced law with his father, Irwin I. Cohn, '17, who passed on to his son a love of the University, a love of the law, and a sense of public duty and philanthropy. Judge Cohn's leadership gift of \$500,000 to establish the Irwin I. and Avern Cohn Dean's Discretionary Fund will honor his father and recognize the strong and continuing bond between the Cohn family and the Law School. This fund will generate discretionary funds for student and faculty opportunities as they develop in the future.

In addition to being a long-standing supporter, Judge Cohn has participated in the life of the Law School as a member of its Committee of Visitors and as a visiting lecturer. His generous gifts to the Law School reflect his abiding commitment to advancing the standards of American jurisprudence and the study of law at Michigan.

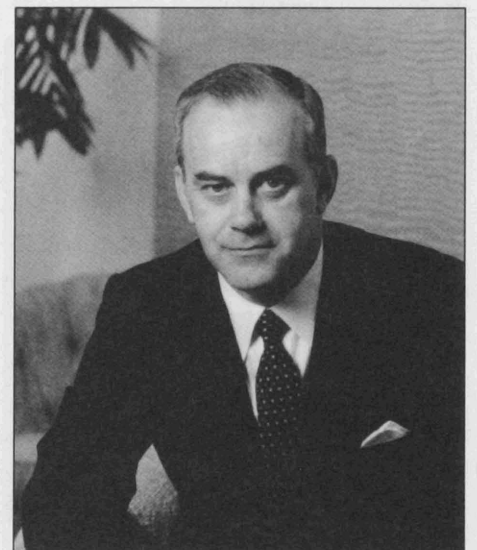


Robert P. Luciano Helps Law School Look Toward the Future

Robert P. Luciano, '58, has maintained a long-term commitment to research and development and pursued clearly focussed goals in his capacity as chairman and chief executive officer of Schering-Plough Corp., the New Jersey-based pharmaceutical company.

His concern for investing in the future has carried over to his generous support of the Law School. In response to the Law School Campaign's ambitious goals, Luciano has pledged to increase the Robert P. Luciano Endowed Dean's Discretionary Fund, which he established in 1986, five-fold to a total of \$500,000. "This is a way of giving something back to the Law School," he explains, "and also of giving the dean some of the flexibility I know a chief executive needs."

Luciano credits the Law School with providing the educational foundation for his career success. His financial support of the School is echoed by his volunteer support. Among his many volunteer activities on behalf of the University, he is a member of the Committee of Visitors and the Law School's New York Major Gifts Committee.



Planned Giving



In addition to outright gifts of cash and securities, the following ways of giving also benefit both the Law School and the donor:

Charitable Remainder Trusts

Donor transfers assets to either a charitable remainder annuity trust or a charitable remainder unitrust for the benefit of the Law School. An annuity trust distributes a fixed income, an agreed upon percentage of the fair market value of the assets at the time the trust is created, to the donor and/or beneficiary during their lifetimes, while a unitrust distributes variable income depending on the fluctuating market value of the assets.

- *Benefit to the Law School*
After the time period fixed by the donor, the assets of the trust are distributed to the Law School.
- *Advantages to the Donor*
The trust provides an annual income for the life of the trust, creates an immediate income tax charitable deduction, alleviates capital gains taxes on appreciated securities and/or property transferred into the trust, provides diversification of investments and professional management, and saves estate taxes by reducing a donor's taxable estate.

Charitable Lead Trusts

Donor transfers assets to a charitable lead trust for the benefit of the Law School. During the donor's lifetime or during a predetermined trust term, the trust will pay income to the Law School. After that time period, the assets will be returned to the donor or the donor's beneficiaries.

- *Benefit to the Law School*
A charitable lead trust can provide immediate and substantial support to the Law School.
- *Advantages to the Donor*
A charitable lead trust makes use of assets not currently needed for income. The trust may reduce gift or estate taxes, or, if the assets are returned to the donor, may provide a reduction in income taxes.

Donor Pooled Income Fund

Donor makes a contribution of at least \$10,000 to the University of Michigan Donor Pooled Income Fund. The donor and/or a designated beneficiary will share in the income of the Fund during their lifetimes.

- *Benefit to the Law School*
When the donor and the designated beneficiaries are deceased, the donor's share of the Fund is transferred to the Law School.
- *Advantages to the Donor*
The donor derives income from a large diversified professionally managed portfolio. Because the gift will ultimately benefit the Law School, a section 501(c)(3) charitable organization, the transfer of appreciated securities to this Fund will avoid capital gains tax liabilities.

The Albert and Virginia Early Charitable Remainder Trust

Albert D. Early, '37, and his wife Virginia have established a charitable remainder unitrust that will ultimately fund the Albert D. and Virginia B. Early Visiting Professorship. This unitrust offers major benefits to the Law School and the Earlys. The school will gain an endowed visiting faculty position for tax law and support for research on tax policy. The Earlys received a charitable deduction upon the transfer of appreciated securities used to fund the trust while mitigating capital gains taxes and

enjoying future estate tax savings by reducing their taxable estate.

Mr. Early knows well the tax advantages of a unitrust. He is a retired partner and former head of the tax department of Milbank, Tweed, Hadley & McCloy in New York. He also recognizes another benefit of this financial arrangement, regular income payments.

The unitrust provides us with a stream of income for as long as my wife and I live, and it's a wonderful way for us to give something back to a great law school.

New Bequest Commitments — \$15 Million

FROM THE WILL OF WILLIAM W. COOK

Believing, as I do, that American institutions are of more consequence than the wealth or power of the country; and believing that the preservation and development of these institutions have been, are, and will continue to be under the leadership of the legal profession; and believing also that the future of America depends largely on that profession; and believing that the character of the law schools determines the character of the legal profession, I wish to aid in enlarging the scope and improving the standards of the law schools by aiding the one from which I graduated, namely, the Law School of the University of Michigan.



William W. Cook completed his magnificent gift, the buildings of the Law Quadrangle, and created the equally important William W. Cook Endowment for Faculty Support through a bequest. In subsequent years, the testamentary gifts of other provident donors such as Frederick L. Leckie, Julian and Marguerite Wolfson, and Clyde Alton DeWitt created major endowed funds that will benefit students and faculty of the School in perpetuity. Professor Peter Westen proudly holds the Frank G. Millard Professorship established by the generous bequest of Dorothy E. Millard.

Recognizing the impact that these gifts can have, the school has established a goal of \$15 million for new bequest commitments made through provisions in estate plans. These provisions may transfer specific monies or percentages of estates to the Law School for any purpose, from general support for the School to specific uses such as scholarships, professorships, program or Law Library support.

For some donors, a bequest is a singular financial opportunity to make a major commitment of assets to the Law School. For others, a bequest is the culmination of a lifetime of significant support. In both cases, such a remembrance is tangible evidence of a generosity of spirit and a belief in the value of the fine legal education the University of Michigan Law School offers.

All new bequest commitments made during the Campaign (July 1, 1990 through June 30, 1997) will be counted toward the goal if the individual making an estate plan provision for the Law School informs the School of the type of commitment and an estimate of the anticipated expectancy. In addition to taking part in the Campaign, these donors will also achieve recognition in the University's John Monteith Society.



Law School Fund Unrestricted Gifts — \$15 Million



As its part of the Law School Campaign, the Law School Fund embraces a new, unprecedented challenge: to raise \$15 million in annual unrestricted gifts. For the School, these gifts constitute the fastest growing component of the operating budget. Unrestricted dollars, which once provided the extras, now support essential needs of the School's academic program each year and give the dean the flexibility to take maximum advantage of new opportunities as they arise.

To reach its goal of \$15 million in unrestricted gifts, the Law School Fund will look to all graduates for support. Through the efforts of a comprehensive network of regional, firm, class and Partners in Leadership volunteers; mail appeals; and a student phone calling program; the School will encourage each University of Michigan Law graduate to participate in the Campaign with an annual unrestricted gift to the Law School Fund. The Law School Fund asks those currently participating—approximately 40%—to increase their annual gifts. The Fund asks those who are not regular contributors to consider this Campaign as the time to begin a practice of annual support.

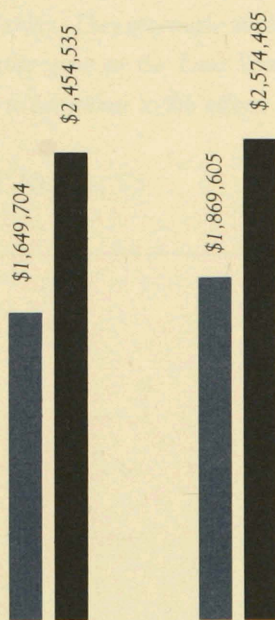

Partners in Leadership

Established four years ago, the Law School's Partners in Leadership program offers deserved recognition to the graduates and friends whose annual gifts total \$1,000 or more (including matching gifts). In addition, it encourages increased annual support. The growth of private giving in response to the program is significant. Since its inception, the Law School has realized a 60% increase in alumni recognized as Partners.

The Partners in Leadership program is primarily a volunteer-driven effort enhanced by phone and mail appeals. Under the dedicated guidance of the School's National Partners chair, John M. Nannes, '73, volunteers set a leadership example by contributing \$1,000 or more. They then call five to ten colleagues, friends, or classmates to encourage a similar gift. During the life of the five-year Campaign, the Law School looks forward to continued growth of the Partners in Leadership program.

Advocates for Excellence

To emphasize the importance of undesignated annual gifts and to encourage increased support, this year the Law School established a new recognition level, Advocates for Excellence. Graduates are recognized as Advocates for annual contributions of \$500 to \$999 (including matching gifts) during a fiscal year.

This year, the Law School realized a 22% increase in gifts of \$500 to 999. This goes to show that when asked, Michigan Law School alumni will step up to the challenge of helping to sustain Michigan's name in legal education.

100% Participation

Two years ago, the Law School Fund established the *100% Participation Program*. Its purpose is to encourage all Law School alumni practicing in firms with ten or more Michigan graduates to become annual participants in the Law School Fund. The program's format is basic. A Law graduate from each qualifying firm is enlisted as a "Captain" to personally solicit gifts from other U-M Law alumni in the firm, aiming for 100% participation. The names of all firms that reach 100% are prominently displayed throughout the following fiscal year in the Law School Placement Office.

This 1991-92 fiscal year, the 100% Participation Program saw remarkable success. Seventy-three firms, 22 more than last year, took part. As the number of firms involved grew larger, so did the number reaching the 100% goal. Participating firms not reaching 100% also deserve recognition. Their rate of participation was well above the average 40% for Law School graduates with three out of every four firms involved achieving over 50% participation. This success reflects the hard work of the firm captains and the competitive spirit of Law School graduates when offered a worthy challenge.

It gives a bit of competitive flavor to the process, which many firms and young lawyers seem to enjoy. They get caught up in it. People who never gave to the Law School before wanted to contribute to this effort.

To mark the occasion of the 25th Law School reunion, members of the Class of 1966 have joined together in a gesture of appreciation for what the School has given them. At their reunion dinner on Saturday, October 19, 1991, Class Gift Chair Ron Olson announced the ambitious Class Gift program, seeking the support of all classmates in a significant gift to the School. Olson and a committee of 17 volunteers led the fund-raising effort, and members of the class have responded generously. 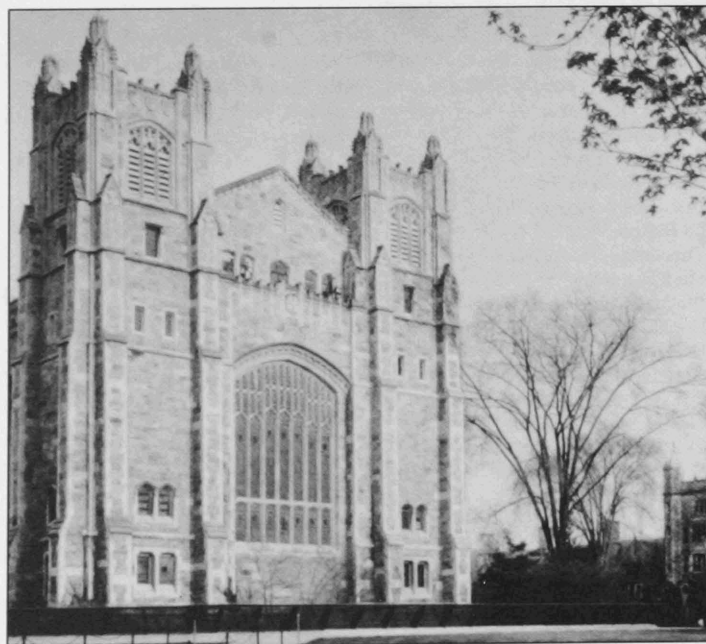

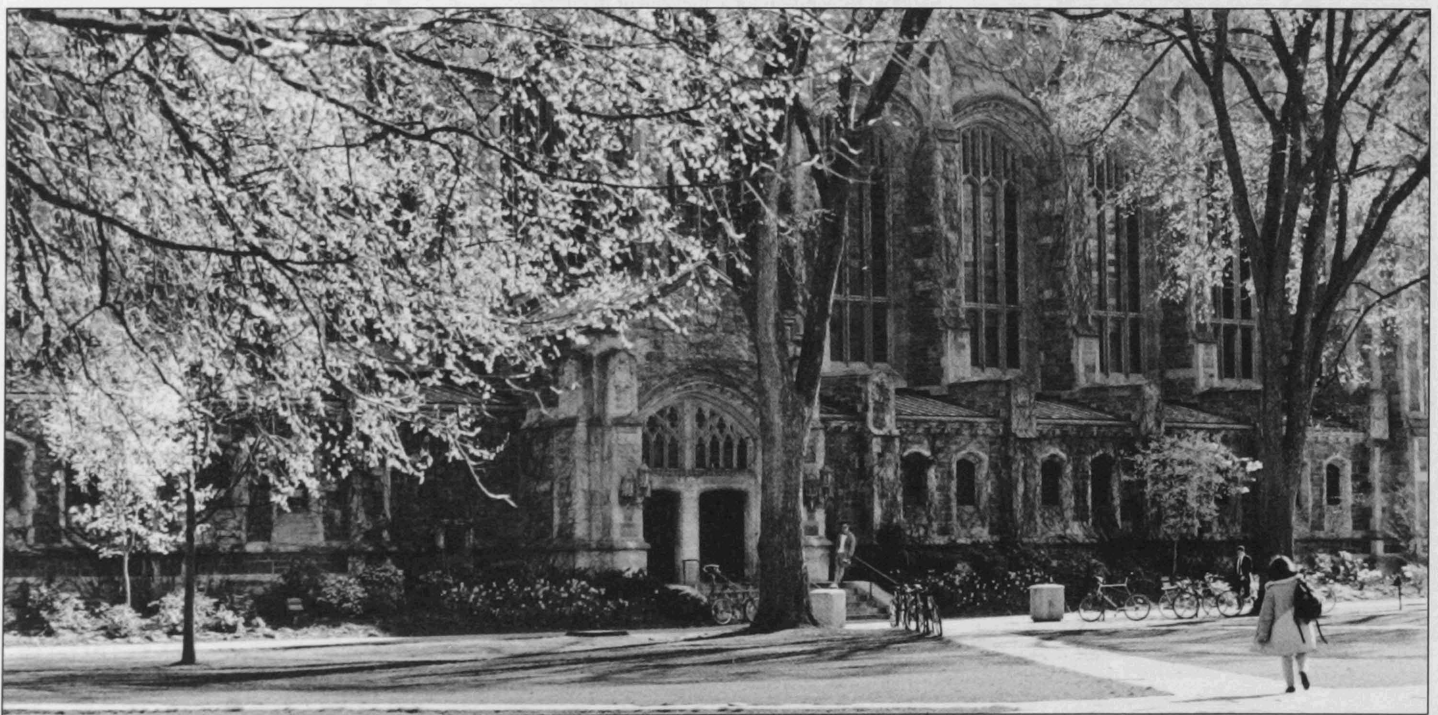
