

In this work Mrs. Underwood has made an important contribution to the reference literature of the natural sciences. PREFACE

Since Mr. Frank L. Burns published <u>A Bibliography of Scarce and Out</u> of Print North American Amateur and Trade Periodicals Devoted More or Less to Ornithology (1915) very little has been published on this subject. The present bibliography includes only North American minor natural history serials in the libraries of the University of Michigan. University publications were not as a general rule included, and no attempt was made to include all of the publications of State Conservation Departments or National Parks.

I am greatly obliged to the late George Seth Guion of New Orleans, Louisiana, who was very generous in making available his fine library of early and scarce ornithological publications. Since his death, the University of Michigan has fortunately been able to purchase his library. Mr. Guion's catalogue of his library with notes and annotations has been a very valuable source of information and is credited to him in the many instances where it has been used.

Additional information has come from a wide variety of sources. Libraries and bibliographies have, of course, been used to as great an extent as possible, but, because many of these minor journals had so brief and precarious existence with often irregular issues and changes in titles, publishers, and editorial policy, the search for information for adequate collation has not infrequently been long-drawn-out and tortuous. I am grateful to many persons who have provided data or at least have been willing to answer correspondence and provide the name and address of an ex-editor or some member of a local natural history society from whom information could be obtained. A number of collectors of natural history journals have also been very helpful in supplying information about copies and runs in their possession.

Mengel, graduate student in the Museum of Zoology, University of Michigan; Dr. Robert W. EXPLANATIONS

In addition to the main entry the information listed includes, wherever possible, frequency of publication, changes in title, editors, publishers and place of publication, the numbers published, whether listed in Burns, <u>Bibliography</u>, and the holdings of the libraries of the University of Michigan. The form of entry generally follows the <u>Union List of Serials</u> and the University of Michigan catalog. In case of several changes in title for the same serial, the last title is used with cross references from the previous titles. Usually, the paging for the volume as a whole is indicated. Wherever this was impossible or not feasible, separate paging for individual numbers is given. Brackets are used whenever the first or last page is not numbered but is included in the paging, i.e., 1_1 -20. The paging if numbered includes only the first and last pages of a number, i.e., 1-20; if the pages are not numbered, the total number is indicated, i.e., 20 pp. The open entry is used for serials being currently published, i.e., vol. 1-; date - .

<u>Union List</u> records this publication as volume 1, numbers 1-8. No more published.

Volume 1 contains only numbers 1-4, and volumes 2 and 3 each contains 12 numbers.

Listed by Burns. Casey A. Wood lists 5 volumes, which probably is a misprint, for the volumes are not in McGill library. No more published.

With volume 14, the title changed to the <u>Animal World</u>. With volume 15, the title again became the Snowy Egret.

Burns states that the <u>Naturalist's Companion</u>, Brockport, New York, transferred subscriptions to this magazine in May 1887. In the August 1887 number of the <u>West American Scientist</u> it is stated that the <u>Hoosier Naturalist</u>, Valparaiso, Indiana, sold its interests to the <u>West American Scientist</u>. Burns states that the <u>Western Naturalist</u>, Madison, Wisconsin, transferred subscriptions to the <u>West American</u> <u>Scientist</u> in May 1888. Burns states that the original title was the West-American Scientist, the hyphen was discarded after the fifth number. With whole number 93, September 1900, page 41 and continuing through whole number 100, April 1901, page 172, appears Botany of Southern California by Charles Russell Orcutt. The contents note on the cover of number 93 is repeated through number 100, although the numbers (in this library) contain only Botany of Southern California. Burns states that this work sometimes appears lacking the first 41 pages of the full volume in a cover entitled: Botany of Southern California, a reference work by Charles Russell Orcutt. Volume 20 was issued with the added title page of Molluscan World, volume 1, 1915, pages 1-270. A note was made in volume 22, number 4 (whole number 161) that in volume 20, 400 species of west American Mollusca were described, the price listed as \$3.00. An index was issued separately at \$.50 forming a check list of over 3000 names of west American Mollusca. Several magazines reprinted almost completely from the West American Scientist, included were the West American Mollusca, 1900-1901; California Art & Nature, 1901-1902; and the Oregon Naturalist, Eugene, Oregon, 1891.

Burns states that volume 6 was published by Samuel Carson & Company, the remainder to 1914, by C. R. Orcutt. Volume 7 (whole numbers 62-63) was published at San Diego, San Francisco, and Orcutt, California, and volume 8 (whole number 64) at Los Angeles, Orcutt, and San Diego, California. Volume 15, numbers 1 and 2 (whole numbers 127 and 128) were published by Art & Nature Company, National City, California. Any other irregularities in publishing cannot be ascertained from the material this library has. Burns states that there are a number of typographical errors in dating and enumeration and that not all numbers have covers. The volume numbering is very confused. The whole number seems to be more consistent. With volume 10 (whole number 93), columns were used instead of page numbering. This method appears to have continued in most of the succeeding numbers. Union List records an index for volumes 1-4 only. With volume 7 (whole number 52), a supplement appeared called Literary and Educational Supplement, number 1. Number 2 appeared in volume 7 (whole number 53), and number 3 appeared in volume 7 (whole number 55).

This is or was a well-known publication and hardly needs further annotation. It received contributions from such well-known scientists as Cockerall, Stejneger, and Eigenmann. A number of new species of animals were described here for the first time, and many of the contributions appearing in the <u>Scientist</u> were original and of definite scientific value. -L. R.
