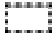

















## HOW TO CREATE ART

1. Think of a few concepts that you can relate to, for example, family life, personal interests, hobbies, recreational activities, or ways that you spend your leisure time.
2. Select several images from the internet or take your own photographs of things that represent those concepts.
3. Import 2-3 of your images into the ACE for Art interface.
4. Use the tools options to transform and combine your images. Consider tool choices such as paintbrush, text, smudge, or experiment with special effects.
5. Cut and paste piece of the various images to create a new piece of visual art.
6. Save the finished piece of art and upload your work to the ACE for Art website.

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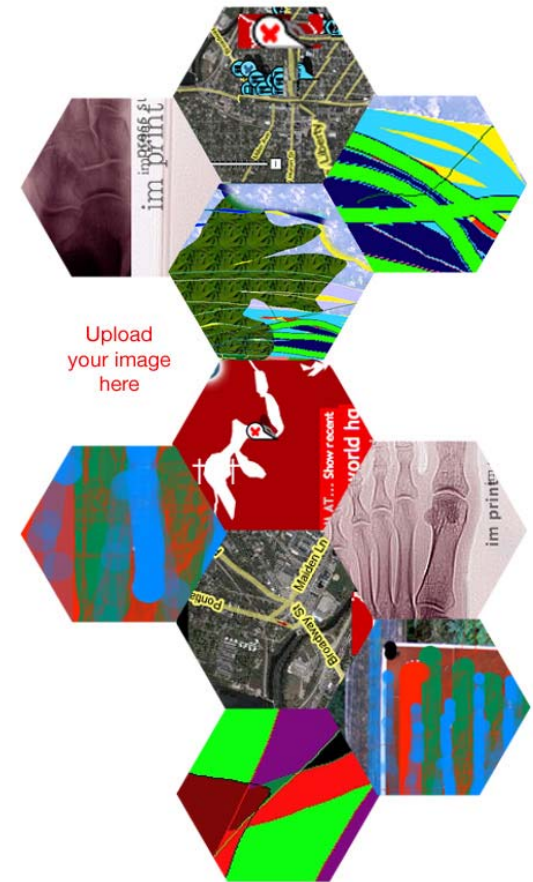
## ACE FOR ART TOOLS

-  **Selection**—choose an area of the image to work with; click outside the selection to clear it (and select the entire image)
-  **Elliptical selection**—like selection, but chooses a elliptical or circular region
-  **Lasso**—drag the cursor to choose an area of the image to work with; the selection shape will automatically close when you stop the drag motion
-  **Polygon lasso**—make a series of single clicks to choose an area of the image to work with; the selection shape will automatically close if you double-click
-  **Magic wand**—selects a continuous region that matches the color you choose (adjusting the “Tolerance” Option will result in larger selections)
-  **Pencil**—drag the cursor to draw a continuous line
-  **Paintbrush**—drag the cursor to draw a continuous stroke; enabling the “Fade-out” Option will create strokes that fade out as you draw them
-  **Paint bucket**—fill a region of the image with a color of your choice
-  **Text**
-  **Eraser**—drag the cursor to erase parts of the image
-  **Color sample**—click on a color anywhere in the image to make it your new foreground color
-  **Gradient**—drag the cursor to create a gradient fill between the foreground and background colors; try adjusting the Options and use gradients inside a selection
-  **Smudge**—drag the cursor to smear parts of an image together
-  **Zoom**—click to zoom in; press Control (PC) or option (Mac) key and click to zoom out
-  **Pan**—drag the cursor to pan around the image, or to move the image contents around inside the image area
-  **Color chooser**—shows the current foreground and background colors; click a color to choose a new one

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## PROJECT OVERVIEW

Our primary objective is to create an online collaboration which will bring individuals with upper limb paralysis due to spinal cord injury together using rich media and adapted technology to participate in a common goal: an online art collage workshop. Collage is a visual format that allows for a wide variety of creative expression using the integration of mixed media including photographs, drawings, paintings, assemblage, found images, or text. The aim of the online workshop with adapted technology is to provide a channel for conversation and cooperation that is equally inclusive of all participants.

## ADAPTED TECHNOLOGY FOR ONLINE ART

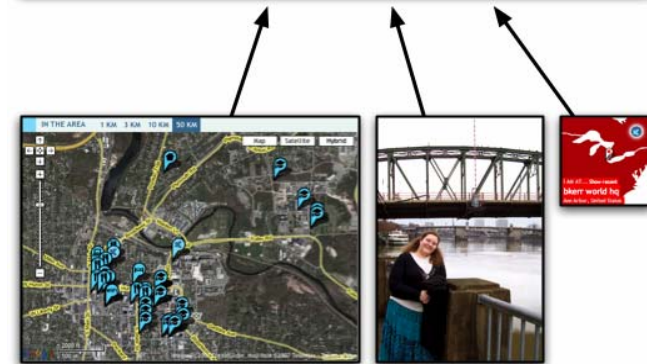
- voice recognition
