

Open Access File Overview.

These data files are associated with an article written by Jennifer Mosley and Sunggeun (Ethan) Park, entitled "Service Providers' Influence in Collaborative Governance Networks: Effectiveness in Reducing Chronic Homelessness" conditionally accepted for publication at JPART.

We conducted the 2014 National Community of Care (CoC) survey with the intent of helping policymakers, funding organizations, and nonprofit leaders better understand the range of what CoCs do and how they work with providers, clients, and government to address the issue of homelessness. The survey data collected in this study cannot be shared due to confidentiality considerations. However, the survey questionnaire and protocol and relevant data gathered from HUD websites are included here for others to replicate the larger study potentially.

This data set is comprised of (1) the 2014 National Continuum of Care (CoC) Survey questionnaire and protocol and (2) publicly available data from three HUD websites. The HUD data sets are comprised of Community Planning and Development (CPD) Awards information from 2005-2014, Demographic information on areas served by CoC sites (sub-region estimates from the 2006-2010 American Community Survey), and Housing Inventory Count (HIC) and Point-in-Time (PIT) counts per CoC from 2015-2007.
